What is NETS? Newborn & Paediatric Emergency Transport Service. They are a state-wide emergency service in NSW who co-ordinate the medical retrieval of critically ill newborns, infants & children when they need intensive care & can no longer be treated at their local hospital.

When a child needs to be transported to a major hospital, NETS organise & send a team to do that transfer, whether that be by one of their own specialty ambulances or via the Child Flight Helicopter.

Among them will be the 'World's Skinniest Magician' - Super Hubert.

At approximately 1pm he will perform a magic show during their lunch.

All local children & parents have been invited to enjoy his show for free.



Lunch for the general public will be a sausage sizzle hosted by your local CFR team, with cold drinks available. This is to raise funds for the fit-out of their new shed headquarters which will be built at Windellama Hall's grounds.

The Windellama CFR (Community First Response) First Aid Unit is wanting new members to give a much needed boost to our Teams' ability to give you the service you are entitled to.

It must be understood that to qualify you must first join the SES (State Emergency Service) and do a certain amount of training under their auspices to enable you to be a CFR member.

The Ambulance Service is responsible for the training as far as CFR unit is concerned.

Both organisations' training is very interesting and rewarding.

The SES has invested a lot of money to start this unit, as has the Ambulance service. SES training is carried out at Lanigan Lane in Goulburn at 6pm-8.30pm each Monday night, except where the Monday is a holiday, and it then becomes the Tuesday night.

CFR training is at the discretion of the Ambulance Service. We also do First Aid for the SES at some other venues.

Windellama SES First Aid & CFR

An early morning call one Sunday gave me a theme for this month's CFR report.

The caller asked if we could have treated an 'acute' Asthma attack? My reply was yes. The caller stated that he did not want to disturb us at 2am. I indicated that a few of our calls have been in the wee small hours of the morning, and that this is of no problem to us.

My main concern was that the patient did not get an early intervention for what is quite a serious complaint, as it was the decision of the people concerned to go to meet the Ambulance on its' way out from Goulburn. This can cause the patient to become unduly stressed and so worsen the complaint.

We were not activated in this case, as no fixed point of contact could be made.

It should be common knowledge by now that as soon as the Ambulance is called, we are automatically activated to whatever may await us.

May I take the opportunity to remind you that early intervention is of the utmost importance. One of our very competent CFR members was only about 5 minutes away from the place.

We must all thank the Ambulance Service for providing us with the opportunity to provide this very valuable service to the people bounded by Bungonia, Tarago, Lake Bathurst, Stuart's Crossing & Nerriga.

Goulburn Growing Marrows for Marrow

The Goulburn Agricultural, Pastoral & Horticultural (AP&H) Society invites you to enter the first Giant Marrow growing competition to be held as part of the 2011 Country Energy Goulburn Show in Australia. All proceeds from this competition will go to the Leukaemia Foundation.

We believe this will be the first stand alone Giant Marrow growing competition in Australia, and the winners in both the open and junior will be the Australian Champion.

The entry fee will be \$20.00 and entrants will receive two seeds and growing instructions, entrants may use their own seeds if they desire.

First prize will be \$1000 for open section and \$500 for a Junior under 16. Marrows will be judged by weight only. Sponsors will be asked to pledge a per kilo amount.

The competition is open to anyone in Australia and an entrant may enter only one marrow.

All proceeds from the competition will go to the Leukaemia Foundation.

Funds raised from the competition will assist the 200 people expected to be diagnosed with a blood cancer in the Australian Capital Territory and surrounding New South Wales this year. Marie Huttley-Jackson from Leukaemia Foundation's Community Relationships team, calls on the community to come and join in the fun and support the Foundation.

The Foundation is committed to providing its vital services to patients and families across Australia and the fundraising support of local communities is vital for the expansion and management of the increased incidence in blood cancers across the country.

The resulting funds will ensure the Foundation can improve patients' quality of life through personalised and practical care. This includes the provision of free services including information and resources, education and support programs, transportation to and from treatment, 'home away from home' accommodation close to major hospitals, practical assistance and emotional support.
