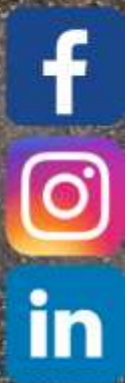

Who is Can Assist?

Can Assist is a grass roots, community based charity dedicated solely to supporting country NSW people and their families affected by cancer. Can Assist offers a range of practical services that include a financial assistance program to ease the burden during a patient's cancer journey.

The Goulburn & District Branch of Can Assist is dedicated to supporting local people and their families affected by cancer. The reality is that many country mums and dads simply cannot afford the treatment, travel and accommodation costs.

How Can Assist Provides Support

Accommodation Can Assist can contribute to the cost of the stay when patients need to travel for treatment or doctors' appointments.

Travel Petrol vouchers to assist with the cost of travel to and from treatments.

Medical Cancer related medication, hospital or scan fees for Medicare approved treatments. Hire of medical equipment; such as oxygen tanks or hospital bed at home.

Food Vouchers Can Assist can provide food vouchers from major supermarkets to help with the cost of groceries.

Utility Bills A contribution can be made towards the electricity, water, gas, phone rent or council rates.

Vehicle Maintenance Assistance with the cost of car registration,, insurance or repairs.

Prepare your vegetable and flower beds for Spring planting, add compost, or clean dry animal manure, dig it into the soil with a generous handful of lime per metre. Do Not lime for strawberry, or tomatoes they like an acid soil.

VEGETABLES TO SOW

Seeds;- Carrots, parsnip, lettuce, asparagus and rhubarb crowns, and onions.

Silver beet, sow seeds August to May ; soil temperature 10-30C, spacing 15-30 cm apart, in full sun or partial shade, in free draining, compost-enriched soil. Ph; 6.0-6.8. Time from planting to harvest; 7-12 weeks. Companions ; Beans, beetroot, cabbage, cauliflower, corn, lavender, onion.

Peas; sow , August to March in soil temperature, 8c-24c, spacing 10-25cm apart in full sun, in free draining soil Ph; 6.0-7.5. Time from planting to harvest; 7-10 weeks. Companions; Beets, celery, cucumber, onions, marigold, nasturtium, rhubarb, aromatic herbs.

Plants; Cabbages, Lettuce, Silver beet, onions-brown, red, white.

FLOWERS

Seeds of petunias, phlox.

Seedlings ; pansy, viola, stocks, snapdragons, aquilegia, carnations, dianthus, primula, dwarf sweet William, alyssum, poppies, larkspur.

Roses and fruit trees can still be pruned. After pruning and spraying, feed them with organic fertilizer.

Spray apple, pear, plum, quince and your roses with Winter Oil, this controls mite and scale.

If you have had trouble with black spot on apples and pears, roses or leaf curl on peaches and nectarine, spray with Lime Sulphur or Bordeaux. With peaches and nectarine, make sure they are sprayed no later than pinking of the buds. If this time of year is wet, it is recommended to spray these trees with Benlate which is a Systemic Fungicide.

Dig out prickly bindies in lawns or sprinkle them with sulphate of ammonia, which burn the weeds.



Feed camellias after blooming and trim them, too, if needed.

Cut back clumping plants, such as lomandra, dianella, liriope , using a sharp pair of hedge shears.

Clip evergreen hedges or hard prune them if renovation is required.

Lift and divide summer-flowering perennials, and pot up spare divisions to share with other gardeners.

Windellama SES First Aid & CFR

There is one subject which has caused a bit of discussion and mirth amongst people and that is that we require a facility to store sand in. We must have dry sand for our particular use and that is to make a wall which will help in keeping water from entering a specific area. You may not be aware of the use of sand bags when we have to tarp a leaking roof. A tarpaulin is not an easy item to control in strong wind conditions, it also is very dangerous to those who are applying same. Sand bags are used to hold a tarp in an anchored position both on the ground and also spaced strategically on the roof area. So if anyone would like to play with sand, I would suggest you come and join the SES to see how it is actually done and why.

Incidentally, dry sand is also used for containing contaminates that may be spilled accidentally. The storage area will be constructed asap.

Our CFR Unit has been reasonably busy lately with callouts. The SES side, thank goodness, has not.

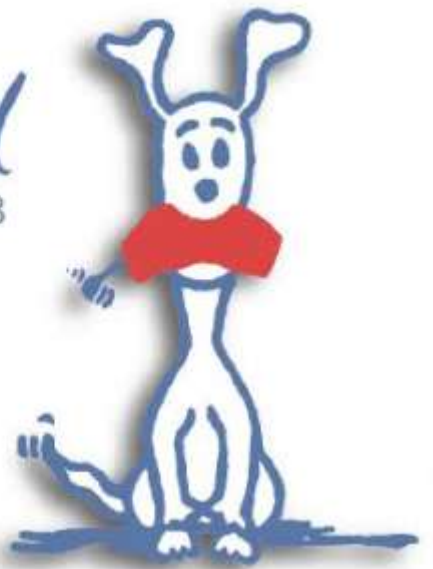

Windellama Garden Club Incorporated News

June 2022 Rainfall

We received an additional drop of 4.5mm making a total of 13.5mm for the month.

July 2022 Rainfall

Just as the ground started to dry out, 38.5mm dropped on the 1st with small drops of 0.5 to 4mm of rain falling over the next few days, just enough to keep the ground soggy like when the initial fall of 38.5mm fell. I supposed everyone has guessed the result? - Gumboots time again.

It is only now the ground has started to dry out a little. The total rain up to the 18th of this month is 50.5mm.

At the end of this month last year we received 671mm at an average of about 95mm per month and this year up to the 18th we have received 635mm at an average of about 91mm per month. Least its keeping the tanks full!

Cold Weather

We had 6 big noticeable frosts recently, with the biggest on Friday 15th July. Even the Broad Beans were flattened and the Silverbeet that was starting to look good is sulking again.

Fruit Trees

The majority of our fruit trees have lost all of their leaves except for the Granny Smith and Pink Lady apple trees. The grape vines have been spur pruned. This method of pruning suits the grapes we have growing, Red Cardinal, Black Muscat, Sultana and White Menindee.

I'm going to try grafting this year and have ordered apple, pear, apricot and cherry scions to try.

Vegetable Garden

This garden is still soggy with the weeds enjoying all the moisture. These weeds will be whopper snapped down soon and covered with newspaper and then old hay. The garden beds will be raised an additional 100mm and ph tested for fertilise requirements and covered with mulch in readiness for spring.

I'm thinking about purchasing a heat pad to attempt getting an early start with tomato and cucumber seedlings to plant out side after the last frosts in November. Once I get them started I will keep them growing by stepping up pot sizes on a regular basis.

Flower Gardens

The five roses removed and the holes I dug took half a ton of garden soil, plus 3 bags of compost to fill. This was before learning about a product called Rootgrow. The new roses have been planted with Rootgrow applied to their roots. Now the wait has started to see what happens.

I'm only thinking about pruning the roses in August.

Bird Life

Our residential Magpies have started to fight daily. The Peewee numbers have increased and the Crimson Parrots are still enjoying the chook pellets.

The native Minor Bird numbers are increasing which I don't want - as they chase away all the small birds. Even the Butcher Bird doesn't go near them. I'm going to have to find a deterrent, so that they will move on including the Butcher Birds.

The egg stealer's the Currawongs have taken up residential rights, actually they have not departed as they have done in other years.

Meeting

We continue to discuss future direction.

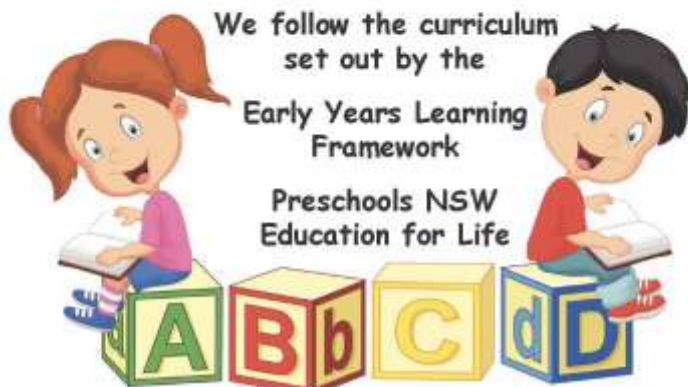

Fire Danger Ratings are changing in September 2022

The way we determine and communicate Fire Danger Ratings is changing. A new Fire Danger Rating System was developed using the latest science to be more accurate and relevant. The new system will be used across Australia, so whether you're at Windellama or traveling, you will see the same system being used and all signs will be updated.

Using the latest science and community input, the new system aims to provide more accurate, simplified and timely information about fire danger. The science underpinning the existing fire danger ratings has largely remained unchanged for more than 50 years. During that time, our understanding of fire and fire behaviour has changed. In recent years, we've mapped the vegetation across the entire country. So instead of the current system using just bush and grass to determine the fire danger, the new system will use eight different types of vegetation – making it more accurate and locally specific.

The new fire danger ratings - issued only on days when there is a fire risk

There are four levels (previously there were six) of fire danger in the new system:

-  Moderate - Plan and prepare
-  High - Be ready to act
-  Extreme - Take action now to protect your life and property
-  Catastrophic - For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas

Goulburn Mulwaree Award

Nominations can now be made for the Goulburn Mulwaree Award. This local award is designed to recognise outstanding service or meritorious achievement by individuals to the community of the Goulburn Mulwaree Local Government area.

Anyone can nominate someone to be recognised and nominations can be submitted throughout the year. Announcements and presentations of this award will be held on the 14th March each year in conjunction with Goulburn's birthday. Nominations are assessed by the Mayor, Deputy Mayor as well as five independent community representatives, who will be appointed by Council at the beginning of each Council term.

Who is eligible for a nomination?

To be considered for the award you need to be a resident within the Goulburn Mulwaree LGA.

How nominations are considered?

Nominations are assessed on individual merit. This includes

- Demonstrated achievement at a high level
- Have made a contribution over and above what might be reasonably expected through paid employment.

Or have made a voluntary contribution to the community which stands out from other volunteers.

How to submit a nomination

Complete the online form or download the nomination form. Nominations can be left with the Goulburn Mulwaree Councils Customer Service section or posted to Goulburn Mulwaree Council addressed to:

An uncomfortable future



The NSW Government and Veolia argue that the strict laws governing waste-to-energy incineration will keep residents safe from any risk of contamination. The NSW Environment Minister states that these laws are enforced by the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) taking “*appropriate regulatory action where non-compliances are identified*”¹. Would anyone in Tarago agree with the Minister that an occasional \$15,000 fine and a handful of warning letters is enough to keep a billion-dollar multinational company in line? It seems a bit like trying to control a Tyranosaurus Rex armed only with a pair of nail clippers. And if we can't rely on regulatory action to keep operation within the legal limits, at some stage there will need to be remediation work done on the resulting contamination.

Veolia and the government acknowledge that the proposed incinerator will produce extremely hazardous by-products – persistent organic pollutants such as dioxins, furans, and polychlorinated biphenyls (BCPs), along with heavy metals such as mercury, cadmium and lead. So what happens if these byproducts leach into our environment or are accidentally dispersed? Ignoring the fact that the chemical byproducts from the proposed incinerator are 'forever chemicals' and can never be successfully remediated, the government and Veolia will have to make efforts to clean up any spills. What response can we expect to protect our town and families?

We've got a great example right in front of us.

In March 2020, the Tarago community was told about the lead contamination at several sites within Tarago. The contamination was identified in 2019 as part of the Transport NSW rail infrastructure upgrade in support of Veolia's Woodlawn operations. Testing was done at various sites in Tarago (including Tarago Public School), and excessive lead concentrations were identified in several places. This included household water tanks and residential properties. At least two children living near the rail corridor returned test results consistent with lead poisoning, and the children at Tarago Public School have not been able to drink the water at the school since.



The New South Wales government held a community information session on 10 December 2020 stating that remediation works would start in September 2021 and be completed by March 2022. So what was the result when a concerned resident contacted the government in June to make sure remediation was complete?

When the resident was finally able to make contact with the responsible employees (none of the government's contact phone numbers on the remediation page worked), they were informed that remediation work had NOT yet started. And, despite the flooding and severe storms we have had over the past year, the government had stopped the promised 3-monthly testing of surface water (which keeps track of how far the contamination has spread).

Not only that, but the government hadn't finished its remediation plan, and had given itself an

extension until the end of this year to finalise the plan (If only all our bosses were so lenient that we could extend our deadlines by more than two years). The new deadline for remediation work is now not until mid-2024 (assuming there are no further delays).

So what can our community reasonably expect in the event of serious contamination stemming from the by-products of Veolia's proposed incinerator? Based on our very real experience with contamination in our town, we can expect:

1. Apologies from the government for “dropping the ball”. Thanks Tom Grosskopf, Transport for NSW².
2. Inaction.
3. Further contamination due to inaction.
4. A government full of regret: “I regret that we have not been able to deliver to the program but more so, that this has not been proactively and openly communicated”. (Again, Mr Grosskopf – is he really stating that the lack of communication is more regretful than the failure to clean up the lead contamination?)

Comforting platitudes:

“I trust this information has given you some comfort that while progress has been slower than communicated efforts continue to remediate the site.” (Tom Grosskopf)

Well, I'm sure we are all feeling comforted. Why should we be worried that the NSW Government didn't follow through on what was promised in meetings with the Tarago community? Why should we be worried that extreme weather events have likely spread the contamination further? Why should we be worried that Transport for NSW has done further track work on the contaminated rail corridor before remediating the site?

This example of the NSW Government's regulation and remediation in addition to over a decade of inaction on breaches of Veolia's existing Woodlawn license conditions makes clear we can have no “comfort” that the EPA and greater NSW Government will ensure human health and the environment of Tarago and surrounding areas are protected from the toxic by-products of Veolia's proposed incinerator.

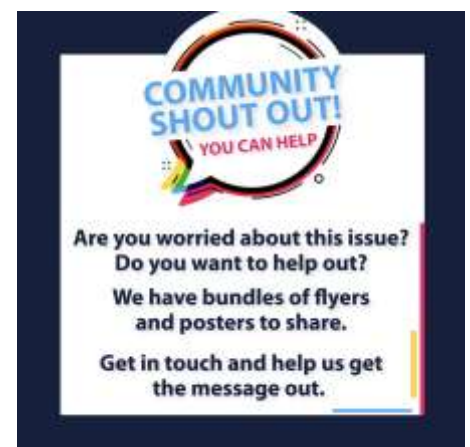

Alyssum is a very useful plant to add to your garden as it is a good nectar plant, especially for Hoverflies. A Hoverfly is a tiny insect with a very specific proboscis that it uses to feed on the Alyssum flower. They then in turn feed on aphids, small caterpillars, thrips and other small pest species.

The camellias in the other gardens continue to thrive, with a few still flowering, and the lomandras, hardy as ever, providing a lovely contrast.
