# Community Notice Board

#### **WINDELLAMA EMERGENCY HEROES**

In mid-November 2019, Windellama Rural Fire Service Brigade (WRFS), dispatched by air, two personnel to Grafton to assist in fighting the enormous fire that had gripped that area. Little did WRFS know, that for the next two months they would be continuously called upon to protect people and properties in various locations in the South-East of the State.

Those persons were no sooner back, when WRFS committed units to a RFS Strike Team to battle the Black Range Fire at Braidwood. Whilst undertaking this task, on the 5<sup>th</sup> December, a further 2 crews were sent to a fire at Tirranaville. The 7<sup>th</sup> December saw 2 units of WRFS from the Black Range Fire move with the Strike Team to deal with the Currowan Fire at Mongarlowe with orders to protect people and properties. This fire was to achieve Mega-Fire status.

As this was going on, a further deployment of WRFS crews was undertaken on the 16<sup>th</sup> December to fight the Green Wattle Fire near Taralga/Wombeyan Caves. WRFS were now severely stretched and committed over 200Kms of our area on a 24 hour basis.

Eventually the Currowan and Tianjara Fires combined into a Mega-Fire and the Strike Team was forced back to defend the Nerriga township and surrounds. Although some outlying properties were destroyed, the town itself was saved by this Strike Team, who valiantly stood their ground and refused defeat. On the 21<sup>st</sup> December a unit and bulldozer of WRFS were completely overrun and isolated by this fire at the Corang River. Following their training, they allowed the fire to pass over and around them and calmly fought their way out. Personnel were then rotated night and day through those WRFS units at Nerriga until 28th December. But still no rest for WRFS!

Within 1 hour of the Bungonia RFS briefing on 28<sup>th</sup> December the Bungonia Fire broke out. Trucks of the WFRS were dispatched on an ad-hoc basis. At the same time others were deployed to Mogo Rd and Roberts Rd when the Currowan Fire jumped the Shoalhaven River to the South. On the 4<sup>th</sup> January 2020 the Mega-Fire jumped the Nerrimunga Gorge <u>and</u> the "Horseshoe" at Stewarts Crossing. More personnel of WRFS were reacted to these, bringing these fires to a standstill. **Finally**, on 9<sup>th</sup> January after almost 2 months of units continually going all ways, day and night, the members of WRFS as a Brigade could rest. The Jacqua Creek/Bungonia and Spa Road Windellama Fires were not under control until the 15/16<sup>th</sup> January. Of course individuals are still involved in "mopping up" and on stand-by duties as this is being written.

A few salient points need to be made at this time:

- a. The cooperation in working with the National Parks and Wildlife Service was first rate.
- b. Out of the area Brigade members sleeping "rough" in the Fire Shed to help their "brothers-in-need ".
- c. Strike Teams and Rear Area Fire Teams from Yass and The Hills District of Sydney serving alongside the WRFS to protect the Windellama area.
- d. The magnificent camaraderie of local brigades, eg. Bungonia, Tarago, Tallong, Nerriga, Taylors Creek, Gundary etc working with WRFS with one purpose in mind...to look out for each other and the community.



# Windellama Historical Society from Rex Hockey

I thought you may have missed reading this article which appeared in the Goulburn Herald and County of Argyle Advertiser Saturday July 15, 1848 Page 4. I was most amused at the terminology used in the commentary.

Goulburn Herald and County of Argyle Advertiser (NSW: 1848 - 1859), Saturday 15 July 1848, page 4

FIGHT BETWEEN PADDY SINCLAIR THE ENFIELD GENERAL, AND WILLIAM SPARKES, ALIAS JOHNNY HEKI, FOR £100 TO £80 A SIDE.

For the gratification of a portion of our readers we copy the following account of this combat from 'Bell's Life in Sydney,' (although it is to be understood that we do not profess to do so generally.) It took place in the neighbourhood of Cook's River, near Sydney, on Wednesday the 5th of July. The following are the particulars o

#### THE FIGHT.

Round 1.—As they tood the scratch, the disparity in their condition was apparent to all: Sparkes showed splendid training, with his flesh firm, and apparently in vigorous health; while, on the contrary, Sinclair exhibited looseness of muscle, and a flabbiness altogether the reverse. As they threw themselves into position, the attitude of both was strikingly beautiful—Sparkes keeping his arms at a indicious elevation, and Sinclair shewing far greater caution than he exhibited at his first meeting. No time was lost: Sinclair feinted with his right, Sparkes retiring, when the Pet unceremoniously followed him up, planted his left on the windpipe, and Sparkes, after an ineffectual attempt at retaliation, slipped down.

2 —Sinclair rushed determinedly at his man, catching him heavily on the ribs. Heki beat a retreat round the ring, when, after a few exchanges, in which Sinclair nabbed an unenviable monthful, the latter retorted with a round handed blow on the back of the neck, which sent Sparkes to earth.

3 -No lack of confidence in either men; Heki essayed his left, getting home slightly on the ribs, and on receiving a like visitation got down.

4.—Sinclair feinted, and almost simultaneously threw in his dexter mawley on the jugular,

Well Windellama News readers a New Year is upon us, 2020 to be precise, 2020 is perfect vision when you see an optometrist and the way I see it is that if people do not step up to the plate and join our Community First Responder Team, you will regret the fact that we can no longer carry on with so few

members. There are in fact only 5 active members left, placing an unreasonable strain on those members still remaining.

May I point out that we are covering Painters Lane then across to Bungonia Heights, Bungonia Village, then all roads that take you towards the Shoalhaven up to Oallen Ford, then across the river to Braidwood – Nerriga Road along to Stuarts Crossing, back up Boro Road to the Braidwood Road and back through Tarago, Lake Bathurst which then completes the circle to Painter's Lane.

This a much greater area than our RFS has to cover, so you can see our dilemma.

We have been pleased to welcome 2 new members lately, so all is not lost in the SES side of things.

## Windellama Garden Club Incorporated News

#### **November Rainfall**

November rainfall did not improve and 8mm of rain is all we got!

#### **December Rainfall**

Over the month of December we received a spit of 1.5mm.

#### **2019 Total Rainfall**

Total rainfall at our place for the year was 440.25mm, not good. Monthly ave was 36.69mm. It probably would be O.K. if we received 36.69mm each month but it doesn't happen like that, unfortunately.

#### **January Rainfall**

Up to today the 20<sup>th</sup> of this month we received 9.5mm in drops of 0.5 – 2mm. After lunch today we received 8mm the best we have had for some time. Unfortunately, we have missed out on good falls received by other areas.

#### **Fruit Trees**

Our fruit trees are still alive, just. However, the vines like raspberries, Black Berries and even some Grape vines look like they are dead, time will tell. The level of water in our dam is lower than low and the bullshit told by the Real-estate Agent that we had a spring fed dam is most disappointing. We were counting on a regular supply of water to maintain our garden.

#### **Garden Vegetables**

We have been experimenting or rather still on a steep learning curve in growing different things in our plastic covered grow tunnel. Getting the watering method under control is one problem and the heat build up another but we are slowly learning. The capsicum, chillies, eggplant, cucumbers and mixed lettuce are growing well. The tomatoes also are growing and flowering well but not setting fruit. It was the same when we grew them outside, it wasn't until late February that we got fruit and last year, still picking into May.

With the tomatoes I'm starting to believe the hot weather is one reason why they don't set fruit. Dad only use to grow Grosse Lisse and Mighty Red because they set fruit in the hot weather. I have tried Grosse Lisse here but they appear to succumb readily to fungal problems.

#### Flower gardens

What with the drought, snow, lack of water and grasshoppers these gardens are virtually non existing.

#### **Bird Life**

We still have the normal contingency of birds competing with our 4 aged hens for feed.

#### The Bush

The Gum Trees in the bush on the eastern side of our place are severely stressed as said before, but now dropping their bark and adding more to the pile of litter on the ground.

#### Grasshoppers

I found a stockist of Green Guard a product that creates a virus in grasshoppers and thus controls them. However, they only had 5 litre containers that cost an arm and leg to purchase. It does come in 1 litre containers but they did not stock it and or interested in getting it in.

#### **Country Fair**

Will not be happening this year due to the drought and most member gardens non-existing. Personally, I think this event needs something to rejuvenate it. What ever idea is required will need to be something for everyone and that the killjoys can't throw stones at!

## A LONG ROAD AHEAD

**SOUTHERN TABLELANDS** I'm sure that everyone reading this is as devastated and heartbroken about the

bushfire crisis as I am - and sadly it's not over yet. Many fires are still burning, especially in inaccessible areas, and will continue to have a massive impact on our wildlife and their habitat. NSW has been hit hardest with an estimated 800 million of the

billion animals affected to date and approximately 5 million hectares of land burnt - with experts saying that some species have likely gone extinct while others are teetering on the brink. Appallingly, nature in NSW may never be the same again - but it is vital that we do all within our power to assist the natural recovery of both our native wildlife and our mutual environment. There is a very long road ahead.

Summer is always a busy time for wildlife rescue but, because of the conditions, this season has been frantic. In December 2019 alone there were over 20,000 calls to WIRES 1300 line, a 14% increase on the previous year, and volunteers attended over 3,300 Unfortunately, that pace has continued into 2020 and shows no signs of Yellow-faced honeyeater drinking from a birdbathand slowing down any time soon.

Our branch is always in need of more members, and this catastrophe has only reinforced that need as we are struggling to keep up with the number of calls we are getting for assistance. Being a member does not require you to be an actual carer unless this is your wish, there are many other ways in which you can help. For example, administrative positions, transport of animals to and from carers and vets, fund raising, sewing/knitting pouches, making possum boxes, helping with constructing aviaries, pens and shelters to name just a few. This support is absolutely vital so that we can provide the best possible care and outcomes for the creatures that come our way.

The WIRES mission is to actively rehabilitate and preserve Australian wildlife and inspire others to do the same. Following the catastrophic events which have befallen our country, this is a mission that is now even more important than ever.

# February in Your Garden

#### By Irene Turner



I hope everyone has had some of the rain, after such a dry spell.

If plants are suffering from the dry heat give them a good trim, and a good soak with Seasol, after the worst of the heat is over.

#### **VEGETABLES TO PLANT NOW;**

Asian greens, beetroot, brocoli, brussel sprouts, cabbages, carrots, cauliflower celery, chives, kale, kohlrabi, leeks, lettuce, parsnips, radish, silver beet spring onion, swede and turnips.

#### **FLOWERS**;

Like petunia, and others that like the hot weather they can still go in.

Lightly prune roses and give them a feed of rose fertilizer, to help with Autumn flowering. Ensure camellias don't dry out now that their buds are forming. Prune off burnt and discoloured hydrangea heads.

Lift and divide clumps, of lilium bulbs, once all the leaves have turned yellow. Tie tall dahlias to stakes with soft ties as plants grow.

#### **Watch out for Spider Mites**

During hot, dry weather, these minute sap-suckers can be especially troublesome. The adults have 8 legs. They are mostly noticed by the damage they cause- dried-out, discoloured leaves, and distorted flowers- and fine webbing they hide under. They don't like being wet, so it's worth spraying water under affected leaves, natural



predators such as mite-eating ladybirds and lacewings do a good job of cleaning up infestations.

### Willow Glen Gardeners

January's meeting of the Willow Glen Gardeners Club was held at the State Emergency Service (SES) hall at Windellama, where we all benefitted from a talk and demonstration of Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). One of our members, Kevin, is a long-term SES member and gave a detailed and entertaining presentation on this important subject.

Before beginning the presentation on CPR, we discussed the important role that the SES plays in our everyday lives, lending assistance throughout the year to people in distress. Whilst the Rural Fire Service has quite rightly been the focus of a lot of media attention during the current devastating bushfires season, organisations such as the SES also play a critical role in this emergency and beyond.

We understand that the Windellama SES is looking for new members, so if you have the time and inclination to help your fellow Australians when they are in need, please contact your local SES group and ask about joining.

With the aid of a few dummies (not the Garden Club members), Kevin demonstrated the correct technique for applying CPR. The pressure required to manually get the heart pumping blood is substantial, and sometimes results in breaking ribs. When asked if you should stop if this happens, Kevin responded that a few broken ribs beats dying any day.





We all had a turn at practicing on the dummies to get the timing and pressure right. It can be quite exhausting if you have to keep it up for some time. Kevin reckons the key to success is to keep your back straight.

After tiring ourselves out trying to resuscitate the practice dummies, we moved to one of the highlights of every meeting, that is, morning tea. As usual, members brought a variety of delicious contributions and Kevin had to speak harshly to get us back to the table to continue with the training session.

There was a good discussion on snake bites, and what to do if bitten. Snakes don't always release their venom when they bite, but its best to be on the safe side. Keeping as motionless as possible appears to be the best solution when combined with a pressure bandage, as the venom travels via the lymph system, not the blood, and walking to get help simply pumps the venom around the body. So always keep your mobile phone or equivalent with you, so you can call for help.

partly accepted and we have received \$1680. This has allowed us to purchase the hazardous material storage cabinet and men's health DVDs on yoga, tai chi and meditation.

#### Member's Profile:

**Martin Payne** spent most of his early life in Durban, a coastal city on the east coast of South Africa. Born in 1962 to English parents, who had emigrated in the 1950s, most weekends from

the age of 7 were spent racing dinghies and later keelboats.

The early 80's saw Martin complete an Electronic Engineering Degree from Natal University. Two years national service in the Signal Corps followed. His first jobs had his electronics design experience fully utilised since almost all products were designed from scratch as imports were severely limited. Whilst doing national service and after, he was able to continue sailing regularly. Celestial navigation was an interest and he obtained Yachtmaster Ocean certification in his mid 20s



Jeanette was from Cape Town and visiting Durban representing the Western Cape at Underwater Hockey. They met at the Point Yacht Club in Durban in 1989 and married a few years later. 1994 was spent sailing and travelling. Initially a yacht delivery from Cape Town up the west coast of Africa and on to Greece. Then possibly the best 3 months ever, being a skipper and hostie in a flotilla, in the Greek Islands. Being paid to have fun and free Greek cuisine every day! Towards the end of 1994 they hitched a ride on a yacht to Antigua in the Caribbean. A year away was a good break but it was back to reality in 1995.

Seeing the way South Africa was developing, having son Christopher in 1996, "becoming responsible", they decided to investigate UK and Netherlands but emigrated to Australia. In 1998 they were finally able to move to Sydney. They stayed for 4 years, Martin initially working at Cochlear (hearing), doing an MBA at Deakin University and son Jason arriving in 1999.

The thought of living in the country seemed both appealing and possible. They brought land on Mayfield Road, built a basic house and moved at the beginning of 2004. The move to Tarago occurred after Martin had started his own Electronic design and manufacture business. The business 'Micro Solutions' was manufacturing opening roof controllers and solar tracker controllers. Jeanette doing the admin and Martin the hardware and software design. Much of the manufacture was contracted out.

A friend had suggested going off grid and that idea took hold. The Off Grid Solar Accreditation in 2004 was initially to build his own system but resulted in the start of something bigger.

2006 saw a bad drought (but not as bad as now!) and lack of water encouraged the purchase of 25 acres at the end of King Street in Tarago that included a permanent spring fed creek. He now considers he is well and truly home. They are presently in the early stages of building a Certified Passive house in the new Tarago estate in Mulwaree Street. A project trying to prove one can build a comfortable, sustainable home as a net exporter of power, all at a reasonable price. The solar installation business started slowly but in 2007 solar started to take off in Australia as



rebates and feed in tariffs were introduced and panels prices plummeted. Solar is now the core business although the electronic controllers are still produced. Trading as C J Solar and specialising in providing off grid solar solutions to rural areas, Martin utilizes his skills, experience and interests to get the best possible long-term solutions for customers. They have now installed many systems in and around Goulburn Mulwaree and Palerang areas. After upgrading his skill to "fully licenced electrician" he is now one of only a few electricians being responsible for the whole solar installation. He is unmistakably clear about what he provides; "Not cheap but good stuff".

Soon after moving to Tarago, Martin became involved in the community, becoming the first president of Tarago and District Progress Association Incorporated (TADPAI) in November 2004.

The earlier years were spent supporting his young sons riding their ponies at Tarago Pony Club or at local gymkhanas.

Martin was an early member and keen supporter of the Men's Shed. He is also regularly seen on polling days handing out "Vote Greens" cards and catching up with customers and friends.

Sport and fitness are important. Hauling solar panels onto a roof and batteries off a trailer certainly gives the muscles a workout. The horses have sadly become lawn mowers but the laser dinghy makes the odd trip to Canberra and skiing at Perisher is now the winter passion. He considers the Men's Shed a much-needed addition to the growing village. A place where locals can share knowledge and skills gained over a lifetime and support friends in need.

Footnote. Martin designed, installed and commissioned, the 8kW solar system at the Men's Shed which now provides us with an income stream.


