



This is a good time to start a compost, with all the fruit trees, etc., losing their leaves. You can use lawn clippings, animal manure, shrubs (small) & tree prunings. Do not use newspapers, fresh sawdust or wood shavings, eucalyptus leaves or pine tree foliage or old vines, etc., pumpkins if fungus is present.

Start the heap by spreading the material to a depth of 20cm, then give a heavy dressing of agricultural lime & animal manure (especially out of the chook pen), then cover with a thin layer of topsoil or leaves, etc.; build the heap to a depth of 1 metre. If you regularly turn the heap, it will break down quicker. I don't turn my heap & it breaks down slowly. Keep the heap moist but not too wet.

Choose your new season roses now, fruit trees & deciduous trees also. Some fruit trees need a pollinator, ask when you purchase them.

The Meyer lemon is the most suitable lemon tree for our area. They need a warm spot facing north, and if possible against a wall, where they get winter warmth, out of the cold westerly winds. They like acid soil, but feed them in spring & summer with citrus fertiliser. They will also grow in a large pot.

Vegetables:

Broad beans, pea seeds can go in now, & onion seedlings.

Rhubarb crowns can be planted now; they like plenty of rotted manure, compost & a balanced fertiliser, good drainage & plenty of water in the warmer weather.

Strawberry plants can be divided & planted now.

Flowers:

Seedlings planted now will flower in spring. Stocks, pansy, viola, primula, wallflower, Russell lupins, delphiniums, foxgloves, Iceland poppies, sweet Williams & calendula.

The garden that is to lay idle now; turn the soil over & the frost will sweeten the soil.

Plant of the Month

Chives (*allium schoenoprasum*)

Common or onion chives grow in clumps of small white bulbs which send up soft tubular green leaves to 40cm, and from early summer onwards, rounded heads of pinkish purple flowers on stiff hollow stems. Chives can be grown from seed or by dividing clumps in spring.

They like humus rich soil, full sun & need regular top dressing of compost & plenty of water in summer to maintain healthy leaf growth. Chives grow well in pots. Dig up & divide & re-plant clumps every 2-3 years. Plants are usually dormant in winter.

Chive leaves are well known for their use in cooking where their mild onion flavour & fresh bright green colour makes them suitable as a garnish. The buds & flowers also make a delightful addition to most dishes. Use them whole or pull the individual flowers from the head & sprinkle them over the dish just before serving. Medicinally chives are antibiotic & stimulate the appetite.

A spray made from chive leaves is mildly insect repellent & a fungicide & antiseptic. Plants scattered around the garden or grown near roses will help to keep away some problem insects such as aphids, borers & spider mite. Chive spray will also deter aphids.

Try planting chives at the base of fruit trees to repel climbing insects, and under apple & pear trees to prevent apple scab. With regular use, chive spray will lessen the incidence of apple scab, black spot & curly leaf. The spray may also lessen the severity of an attack of downy or powdery mildew if applied regularly, while brown rot can be stopped from spreading by spraying every 2 days.

Spray Recipe

Pour 1 litre of boiling water over a firmly packed cupful of chopped leaves. Cool, strain & use within a few hours.

Illegal hunting and shooting activities

During April there has been an incident on a property adjacent to Covan Creek Road in Lake Bathurst where a number of Wiltshire Horn sheep were mauled by dogs which suffered head and neck injuries which resulted in the stock being put down. The attack on the sheep is similar to reported hunting activities in the same area where dogs have been used to hunt from the side of the road. If you utilise dogs for hunting purposes please be aware that if your animals attack a person or domestic animals, as the owner of the dogs you are liable and criminal action will be taken against you.

For example, under section 16 (1) (b) of the companion Animals Act 1988 relates to owning a dog which attacks a person or animal and also relates to a person who is in charge of a dog which attacks the same carries a fine of \$550. It should also be noted that being in charge of a dog which attacks means you don't need to be the owner of that dog to be liable.

Under the definition of the word "attack" the dog doesn't need to "bit" for the dogs actions to be deemed as attacking.

With a number of deer being sighted in the area, it's a timely reminder of some other relevant offences relating to hunting from a public road. These offences to name a few are;

- Section 93G (1)(a)(i) of the Crimes Act relates to possessing a loaded firearm in a public place.
- Section 93G(1)(b) of the Crimes Act relates to carry the same in a manner likely to injure.
- Section 93G(1)(b) discharge the same in / near a public place

Traffic:

Whilst motor vehicle accidents are down which is pleasing to report, I have noticed speeding drivers in the town are quite alarming, particular around the school zones during the time restrictions and past the police station. Another area of concern is the overtaking of vehicles on double lines just north of the town limit heading towards Goulburn.

These matters will be a focus in the future.

Remember the new legislation below which commenced on the 1st of July 2009:

The new Act creates new offences under section 30 (1) and section 30 (2). Section 30 (1) provides an offence now for a person to **smoke in a motor vehicle** on a road or road related area if there is a person under the age of 16 present in the vehicle. Section 30 (2) provides the driver of a motor vehicle in which a person is smoking in contravention of section 30(1) is also guilty of an offence.

So in short, if someone in the vehicle is smoking and there is a person under the age of 16 also present in the vehicle, that person and the driver are both guilty of an offence.

One other new piece of legislation that has come into affect is that of **child restraints**. Please be aware of the following:

1. Child younger the six months must be secured in a rearward facing restraint
2. Child aged six months to under four years must be secured in either a rear or forward facing restraint
3. Children aged four years to under seven must be secured in a forward facing child restraint or booster seat
4. Children younger than four years cannot travel in the front seat of a vehicle with two or more rows.

Child aged four years to under seven years cannot travel in the front seat of a vehicle with two or more rows, unless all other back seats are occupied by children younger then seven years in a child restraint or booster seat

These laws are now enforceable so please seek further advice if you require it via the RTA or your nearest police station. If I can't provide the information you require, then I will obtain the information and get back to you.

Theft

It's pleasing to report the amount of theft in the area is down. However, there has been reports taken for stolen railway sleepers around both the Tarago and Mt Fairy Road areas. Please note that these are the property of those contracted to remove them. Be mindful that to obtain the sleepers you need to access land owned by state rail. So, to get to the sleepers you will be trespassing on their land and will be prosecuted as such.

Also during April, 18 Merino sheep were stolen from a property along the Glenoval Road in Lake Bathurst. If anyone can assist please contact police at Tarago

or the rural crime investigator at Goulburn Station.

Remember the simple things to prevent theft, stay alert of anything suspicious around your neighbourhood, watch out for your neighbours and remove items from view, especially in vehicles as most offenders are opportunist and will offend if the opportunity arises.

Break & Enters

On the 5th of May a report was taken where a property used as a weekender on the Mayfield Road was broken into. The offender has smashed a window and has gained entry into the building and opened a number of glass sliding doors. On this particular occasion, the neighbour attended the weekender located next door and it appears the offender was interrupted and left before any property was stolen. Fingerprints were requested to attend and examine the scene for any prints that may identify the offender. Police are continually making enquiries to identify the suspect with the matter still under investigation.

Licensed Premises

It's was pleasing to note that over a busy time such as Anzac Day and Two up, there was nothing reported relating to alcohol related crime in the area. Generally I am happy with how the two alcohol outlets are going in the area.

Firearms:

During the month a search warrant was executed in the Tarago area which saw a number of firearms being seized. The owner was subsequently charged with numerous firearms offences.

Also, a state wide firearms audit has commenced. The audit is similar to that of a few years ago. So, please make sure your licence is current and has not expired and your storage cabinet complies with the standards, because when I get your file I will be contacting you to arrange a time and date to inspect your firearms and storage cabinet.

Due to my absence from the area this year, I am running behind with my audits so there will be a commitment to get these firearm audits completed. If I leave a message or a card

please get back to me and organise a time to have your firearms checked. Please don't contact me to make a time as I need to get a file first as it has a reference number on it, which I need before I can complete your audits.

Community Notice:

If you require a Justice of the peace please contact me at the station for assistance.

I thank all those who have taken the time to return their rural property / farm information sheets to the station. If you are yet to complete yours, it would be most appreciated if you could complete and return the form as there are still a lot to be received.

If you require a property inspection form, please contact the station for one to be sent out to you, or you can pick one up from the station during work hours.

I am going to start a register to record your movements when you're away on leave. All this means is if your planning a holiday or just away for a length of time and your house is going to be vacant, then call me and I will record your name, number, contact person in the case of an emergency, and when your leaving and returning. This will help me to patrol your area / house during your absence and hopefully prevent your place being broken into. There is still no guarantees, but I am always looking for ways to prevent break and enters and property theft.

New roundabout to ease traffic flow

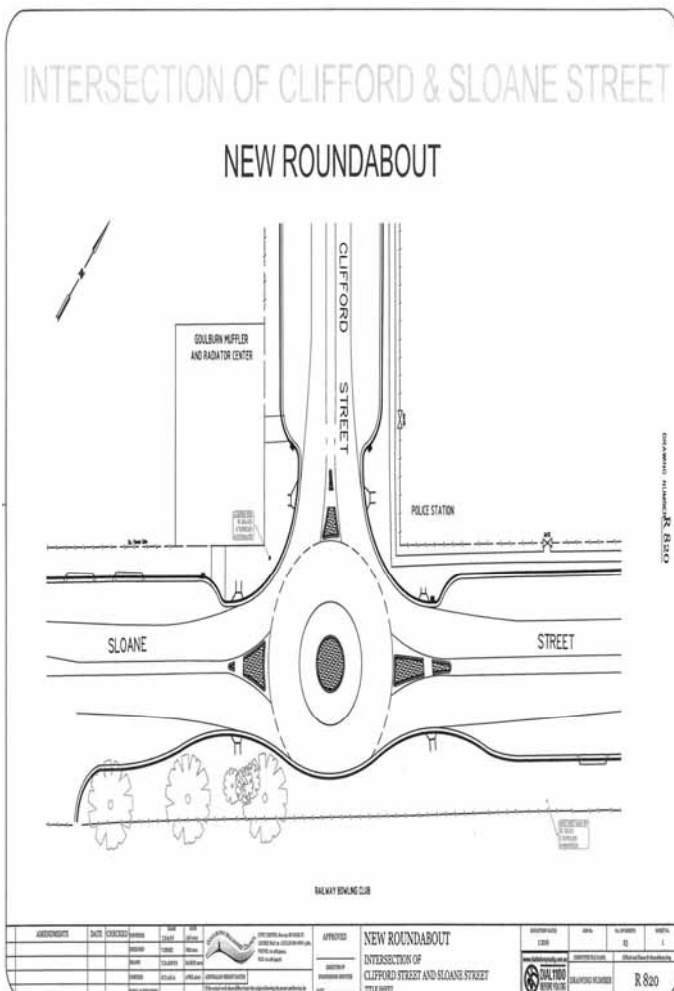
A new roundabout will be installed on the corner of Sloane and Clifford streets, reducing waiting times for motorists and increasing pedestrian safety.

Goulburn Mulwaree Council's Manager of Works Andrew Palmer anticipated that construction would begin in June, and would take up to ten weeks to complete.

“Council has allocated \$500,000 for this project, which has been raised from citywide Section 94 contributions,” Mr Palmer said. Council staff will be able to install the roundabout without completely closing the road, however we will be reducing the speed limit to 20km/h through the workzone. There will be ongoing traffic management throughout construction, and motorists are asked to please follow any directions given to them by Council staff.”

Mr Palmer said the gas main which runs along Sloane St would have to be encased in concrete as part of the work. He also said that Council had consulted the neighbouring businesses, and they are pleased with the proposed design.

“With Sloane St being an arterial road, vehicles turning right into it can often experience lengthy delays, causing driver frustration and unnecessary risk taking. The changes will also improve pedestrian safety, with medians provided to aid in crossing Sloane and Clifford streets. An apron is included on the central island for long vehicles to utilise if necessary, and street name signs will be prominently displayed on its central island,” Mr Aldridge said.

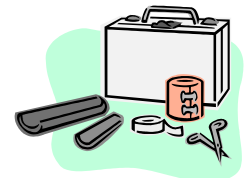
