If you would like to bring some nibblies & drinks for yourself that would be great. It is asked that you take home your rubbish & empties though.

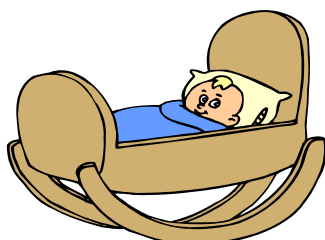
Ladies Information Day 20th May
