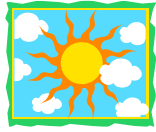

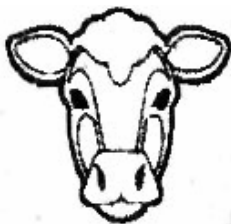

**THE JACQUA SCHOOL BUS RUN 1953**

On a Monday early in February 1953, it would have been the second week of the school year as a complaint called 'being over excited' prevented me from going on the previous week, I caught the 'Jacqua School Bus' on Oallen Ford Rd., to give it today's terminology, at the gate to 'Benduck'.

The bus was a late model pug-nosed (today it is called a cab-over) cabbage green coloured Austin truck probably of 2 ton size. It was driven by Laurie English, from the Spa Road, a canvas cover enclosed the tray and the seats were bolted to the tray. One can only wonder what 'Work Cover' or 'OH&S' would think! Some times Laurie's brother Collin would do the run in his Ford Ute, we would all pile onto the sole bench seat. Alan, Mavis and Trevor McGaw from 'Benduck' boarded at the same time. The next stop was for the 'Sunning Hill' crew, Kerry and Greg Brice, this was at the junction of Jacqua Road, Sunning Hill Rd in those days.

Believe it or not, the next pupils didn't get on until the Spa Road, where Peter and Alice Hush boarded (the reason being that the only dwelling was 'Brooklyn' and there were no kids), then to 'Budjong' to pick up Jennifer Varcoe. Dawn Williams, the youngest member of 'Buburba' homestead was next and the last pupil was Lorraine Steele from 'Eloura'. Peter Croker from 'Lumeah' and Norma Bryant from 'Rosewood' also attended the school but had to find their own way to school because they lived too close to the school for a bus subsidy – when Norman Bryant took over the bus run in 1954 these two were picked up probably gratis as a friendly gesture, Norma being Norman's daughter. When Collin's ute was used two trips were made' as the front seat wasn't big enough for us all at once.

For the record, the bus run was carried out by Ray Croker prior to Laurie English and because it appeared likely that no-one would follow Norman in 1956, AND also because my sister Marilyn and myself HAD to get to school somehow, my father bought a Commer panel-van and continued the run until early 1958, because we were moving to the Tumut/Gundagai area, the Commer was traded-in on a new Volkswagen combi-van late in '56 and Dell Rogers of 'Forest Grove' carried the run on from there.

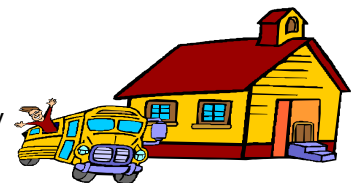
The present Library was the only building on the school grounds and was the class room I attended when I started and John Swaine was the solitary teacher.

The bus run was extended to Sandy Point, I think in 1954/5 but definitely by 1956 when my father was running the bus. Dianne Legge was the pupil.

I have heard complaints over the past nine years, I won't mention any names, of the sad condition of Oallen Ford Road, however, compared to it's condition during my six years at Windellama School – I can only remember the Shire doing work once – it is a veritable highway, even the unsealed bits! I would like a dollar for every hour my father and other residents spent using their own tractors and trucks and shovels, none of them had a tip truck either! Just to make it passable for the 'bus'. Most thought road work was like a 'rain dance' as usually it rained shortly after the crossings and pot holes had been fixed and it had to be re-done.

## Spotted Marsh Frogs

Now that we've had a bit of rain the frogs can all be happy again but last month they were in hiding. Our kids love to swim in one of the dams and discovered that by tipping buckets of water on the dam wall they could make frogs rise out of the large cracks in the mud.

These frogs were easily identified as *Limnodynastes tasmaniensis* (commonly known as Spotted Marsh Frogs) According to internet sources these frogs are often associated with water and before you say "so what" bear in mind many frog species inhabit trees.

Spotted Marsh Frogs are pale salmon to fawny pink in colour and the spots olive green, sometimes with a stripe down their back. They are also one of our most common frogs. They are usually between 30 and 48mm in length and have a large area of distribution with the extremities roughly being Townsville to Hobart to Adelaide.

The males hide in floating vegetation calling to their females and the calls can vary from place to place from a kuk-kuk-kuk to a click or plop sound.

## Dragonfly Trivia

There seem to be plenty of dragonflies about at the moment, one escorted me down the road the other day flying alongside the tractor and seemed to be interested in what I was doing which in turn got me curious about Dragonflies.

They are fascinating creatures, some can travel up to 100 kmh, hover or even fly backwards. They can spot a mosquito at a range of 6 metres and then fly along holding all six legs to form a basket in which they scoop up their prey, this is then eaten while they are still flying.

They also mate in the air which I guess most of you will have seen at one time or another. The females drop their eggs into water, within weeks nymphs hatch from these eggs and live in the water from 1 to 5 years, they emerge from the nymph to become a Dragonfly but this last stage of their life is fairly short.

In ancient times there were species of Dragonfly with wing spans of up to 2 1/2 feet (76cm). One large species of Dragonfly *Petalura gigantea* still survives in NSW, much of it's habitat has been lost or altered and it once inhabited swamps in Sydney and Cronulla. It can still be found in isolated parts of eastern NSW including the Wingecarribee Swamp near Moss Vale and has a wingspan up to 140mm (over 5 inches)

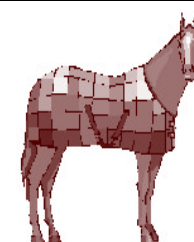
