## NSW RURAL FIRE SERVICE

### Windellama Rural Fire Brigade

#### Bushfire Danger Season Ending soon – BUT not yet.

Bushfire danger season is expected to end 31 March 2023 but that doesn't mean we can be complacent. There is a lot of fuel in the grasslands and it only takes a hot windy day for conditions to support a dangerous grass fire. The Windellama Rural Fire Brigade would like to remind you to remain vigilant and prepared. We urge all residents to take the time to maintain your properties and review bushfire survival plans. Clearing gutters, removing flammable debris, and ensuring adequate useable water supplies are all important year round activities that can help protect your home and property. It's also important to stay informed about current fire conditions and to have a plan in place for how you will respond if a fire does threaten your property.

#### Brigade activity

- Four units from the Windellama responded to a caravan and bushfire. The quick response from the firefighters first on scene helped prevent the fire from spreading further. The blaze was brought under control within an hour.
- Two units responded to a tree on fire that had been blown on power lines. Crews made the area safe and worked with Essential Energy so power could be restored.
- With high winds across February the brigade also removed and made safe several large branches and trees that had blown on to roads in the area.



The Windellama Rural Fire Brigade will continue to work hard to protect our community, but we need everyone to do their part to keep our community safe. Let's all work together to ensure that we are prepared and ready for whatever the remainder of the fire season may bring.

There was a call to a land search at Tianjarrah Falls, the Misper was quickly located, which resulted in us being called off.

We are kept very busy with just a small number of volunteers.

# Windellama Garden Club Incorporated News

Finally, the Windellama Garden Club Inc., request for Involuntary cancellation of our association was accepted and was gazetted on the 20th of January 2023.

The reasons why we sought involuntary cancellation was because we could not meet the fair trading regulations.

Due to the club's NSW Fair Trading cancellation this is my last article under the club's umbrella. Harry Simm.

## **January 2023 Rainfall**

We received an additional drop of 45.5mm in January giving us a total of 80.50mm for this month

## **February 2023 Rainfall**

Friday 17<sup>th</sup> of this month saw the temperature at 3pm reach 104 degrees Fahrenheit (98°C) under the awning at the back door and on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> at 3pm reached 98 Fahrenheit (Bloody Hot) and then we had a welcomed cooling down with a downpour.

The downpour received on the 18<sup>th</sup> saw 11mm in the gauge in very short time. Up until we received the downpour we had only received 8mm for February.

## **Weeds**

Just as I get on top of the Scotch Thistles we get new ones popping up. As soon as I purchase some weed poison, they also will be sprayed. Got to keep on top of the prickles.

## **Fruit Tree**

When the fruit trees were in flower we had good fruit set but all the peaches and nectarines have split degrees and gone woody. This problem could have been due to extra rainfall, a growth spurt due to all the rain, or lack of rain and hot weather, or all of them – take your pick.

The Blackberries and similar type berries produced a feed but the Pears, Grapes and Raspberries did not produce anything at all.

Our Mulberry tree produced a cupful for it's first crop. To encourage it to produce more, will require cutting back by at least a third. Why? Mulberries fruit on new wood.

## **Vegetable Garden**

As mentioned last month my attempts at eating early tomatoes did not eventuate. The late planting of 4 tomato plants have caught up with the early plantings and are also fruiting.

To me, it means tomatoes like some other plants have a season where they grow best. That is when climate conditions meet their needs.

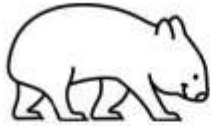
My early attempts at growing early Zucchini's in a purchased Grow bag was also a failure, with lots of small fruit and lots not being fertilised. The same has happened with Zucchini plants in the garden outside. The Zucchini's not fertilised start growing normally, but then start to rot. The solution is to hand pollinate. How? Take the flower on the long stem and remove petals and then stick the yellow stem remaining into the middle of flowers on short stems. The Zucchini's outside, planted in December, have performed way better in growth than the ones in the Grow Tunnel. To me, this is another plant that has a season for growing best.

At our place, since the fruit trees finished with their spectacular blossom display, it is quite noticeable the absence of bees – where have they gone?

## **Flower Gardens**

The roses in pots on the Eastern side have flowered well but now that the temperature has increased, the flowers are being cooked.

The self sown Dahlias have put on a wonderful display again.

If you haven't planted out your cauliflowers, cabbages, Brussel sprouts or broccoli yet, purchase plants and using liquid fertilizer get these plants established for winter harvesting. If left to late broccoli and Brussel sprouts will not mature until spring.

Other vegetables to plant now; lettuce, turnips, radish and white onions.

## FLOWERS

Seedling of alyssum, pansy, viola, stocks, poppy, calendula, carnation, dianthus, polyanthus, larkspur, snapdragon, static, verbena and Virginian stock, plant in the ground where you wish to grow, also can grow in pots. Feed when buds start to appear.

Other seedling to plant are wallflower, sweet Williams.

Perennial plants, providing the weather hasn't been too hot, can go in now. This include hollyhock, Canterbury bells, aquilegia( columbines), delphiniums and pentstemons.

This is a good time to fertilize lawns with good lawn fertilizer to strengthen the lawn for the winter.

Take cuttings of geraniums, fuschia, and hydrangeas. Put the cuttings in a terra cotta pot, a 10cm pot will take up to a dozen cuttings, making sure they are planted around the edge as they get more warmth. Using a mixture of 1 part coarse sand to 2 parts of potting mix, and keep the cuttings moist.


If powdery mildew is a problem, remove the leaves infected, place in the garage bin, Spray with eco-fungicide in a pressure sprayer on both the top and bottom of the plants.. Keep an eye on the plant in the following days and remove any more infected leaves, and respray if needed.

For control of snails and slugs you can make beer traps. Place a container buried into the garden level with the soil a small hole in the top for the snail to fit through a half cup of beer in the bottom. If no beer a teaspoon of vegemite mixed with warm water, will also do the trick. A layer of crumbled paper will also do the trick for slug and mealy worms, they hid in the paper and you can remove and replace, with new paper when caught.

Lime also sprinkle around the plants and on top will help to deter snails and also cabbage moth, or cover the plants with netting

Finally, Little Peter the bull managed to sire 3 calves in January, so he's putting his hooves up for a while in order to gather his strength for his next big effort.
