"Funding under the Capital Assistance Program is open to local government and not-for-profit sporting and recreational organisations."



# TEMPORARY LIBRARY CLOSURE

The Goulburn Library will be fitted with new carpets which will disrupt services over two weeks in May.

The library will close for two days in early May and minimal services will operate for a maximum of two weeks while re-carpeting is carried out, the first new carpet in the library since it opened in 1989.

Branch Officer in Charge Sylvia Brook said to minimise disruption to customers borrowing times had been extended and the library would be open for additional hours over both the weekends before and after the re-carpeting.

**No library service will be available on Monday May 1 and Tuesday May 2 while work around the front door area and service desk is carried out.**

Drop off and collection of reserve items only will be available on Wednesday May 3.

By Thursday May 4 public access to the Internet computers will be available.

"However all other areas of the library including the Regional History room, Children's Room, Youth area, fiction and nonfiction areas will be unavailable until 13 May due to safety precautions whilst the work is being carried out." Ms Brook said.

"The Southern Tablelands Regional Library website ([www.strl.nsw.gov.au](http://www.strl.nsw.gov.au)) will be available throughout the closure and people can also visit Gunning or Crookwell libraries."

Extended borrowing times are already in place for new loans so no loans should be due back during the closure.

The Library will open extended hours on Saturday April 29 and Sunday April 30 (10am to 5pm) prior to closure.

The Library will also open extended hours on Saturday May 13 and Sunday May 14 (10am to 5pm) It will be open all day (10-5pm) Sat & Sun after the closure to allow people to return and use the library's full services.

**Normal services will resume on Monday May 15.**
