

Learn about Council's Community Services over a friendly cuppa

Goulburn Mulwaree locals are being encouraged to drop in for a cuppa and find out more about the variety of services offered through Council's McDermott Centre.

Staff at the McDermott Centre have acquired a new coffee machine in an effort to encourage more people to call in to find out about the services available.

"For some people the thought of requiring a 'Community Service' is a bit scary and we are keen to make the process as easy as possible," Goulburn Mulwaree Council Neighbour Aid Coordinator Kim Sorensen said.

"We offer a range of activities through the Centre, including Respite Care, Community Transport, Neighbour Aid and Leisure Link. It's not just about providing services, it's also about coordinating outings that encourage people to get involved in the community and local activities.

"For example, through Neighbour Aid we have the Menz Biz and Meaningful Meanderings groups, which meet for a social outing once a fortnight. There's also Leisure Link, which provides leisure activities for people with a disability aged 15 to 45 years. Recently the Leisure Link participants went on a whale watching expedition in Huskisson and their next activities are ten pin bowling at Belconnen on 4 October and a girls day out shopping trip on 18 October."

The McDermott Centre, which is located on Auburn St next to Goulburn Post Office, also hosts a number of local special interest groups, clubs and organisations. Its rooms are available for meetings, workshops, seminars and activities.

Community groups and organisations that currently meet at the Centre include GROW, U3A, Goulburn Senior Citizens, a craft group, garden group, cancer network and more.

"The McDermott Centre is a hub for local community services and if we don't offer the service

ourselves, chances are we can refer people to the appropriate organisation or Government Department," Ms Sorensen said.

"Our main aim is to provide accessible services for the frail aged and people with a disability, but there's plenty of activities on offer. We also provide a day respite program each Thursday at the Brewer Centre in Marulan, and an outreach program in Tarago."

Anyone interested in finding out more about local community services for themselves, or a friend or family member, can drop into the McDermott Centre for a friendly chat and cuppa, or call 4823 4478.
