#### **Bulky Waste Disposal Weekend**



I'm again encouraging residents to begin to prepare for the free Bulky Household General Waste disposal weekend, which has been confirmed for Saturday 7th and Sunday 8th November.

Waste Management Centres in Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago will be open from 7am to 4pm on both Saturday and Sunday to cater for the expected larger crowds.

The household general waste weekend is usually even busier than our free recyclable weekend, so I encourage you to get prepared now and to plan your trip ahead of time as there may be some delays.

We do expect some line-ups throughout the day as it's always a popular weekend, but will have plenty of staff on hand to keep things moving smoothly. The main rush is usually early on Saturday morning, so if you don't want to wait around in line we recommend holding off until later in the day, or even Sunday.

Goulburn Mulwaree residents can dispose of up to 2m3 of bulky household general waste (such as household furniture, green waste, cardboard and steel) per property, free of charge at Council's waste centres.

All loads must be transported to one of Council's waste centres, and only domestic items will be accepted.

## Windellama Historical Society from Tom Bryant

**WINDELLAMA.** Sunday-school was opened on last Sunday at St. Bartholomew's, Windellama; but as the time of opening was not generally known there was not that attendance that there otherwise would have been. In future the school will be held at half-past two p.m. on the Sundays on which there is no service in the church. On the Sundays that there is service it will be held immediately after the service is over. Special arrangements will have to be made for those Sundays on which the Lord's supper is dispensed. Mrs. E. Cartwright has kindly consented to fill the office of superintendent, Mrs. J. J. Croker takes the girls' class, Mr. M. Montgomery the boys' class, and Miss E. Croker the little ones. Rose Vale school will resume duty on Monday, the 12th instant. January 7.

**WINDELLAMA**. St. Bartholomew's Church Sunday-school.-The children attending this school were kindly invited by their teachers Mrs. J. J. Croker, Mr. Calthorpe, and Miss Croker), to a picnic, which they provided for their young charges on Easter Monday. There were also several of the Windellama West Sunday. school children present by invitation, as well as a few visitors. When all the children had arrived they were entertained with a very pleasant repast, after which several games were entered upon and continued till late in the day, when tea and cake were again served to the children, after which they returned to their respective homes well pleased with the day's amusement. I might also state that the children who were most diligent at both schools received rewards, such as books, cards, Ac. Church Service.-The usual fortnightly service was held at Windellama on Easter day, when the church was very handsomely decorated with ferns and appropriate texts of scripture done in splash work. A meeting of the parishioners will be held on Saturday, the 6th of May, at St. Bartholomew's church for the purpose of receiving the churchwardens' report and balance-sheet for the past year and for the election of church wardens. TEA-MEETING AT WINDELLIMA —A tea-meeting and sale of fancy-work were held at Windellama on Tuesday, 5th March, in aid of the Tarago vicarage building fund. The day proved a remarkably fine one, though rather too warm, and a large number of people gathered on the ground at an early hour. The sale of fancy-work proceeded briskly till two o'clock, when all adjourned to the luncheon-booth, where a substantial meal was provided, presided over by Venerable Archdeacon Puddicombe, assisted by the Revs. E. B. Procter and W. Anderson. After huncheon various sports were got up, and the company did not disperse till a late hour in the evening. The proceeds of the meeting amounted to £33, viz.. £17 from sale of work and £16 from tickets sold.



Windellama News - November 2020

#### September Rainfall

Towards the end of September we received an additional drop of 24mm making the total at our place 36mm.

#### **October Rainfall**

A better start this month receiving 22.50mm of rain .

#### **Fruit Trees**

Most of the stone fruit are loaded with fruit. Just hope when ripe they don't contain extra protein.

Just a reminder now is the time to start your fruit fly control program with traps or what ever else procedure you have for controlling this pest. The same goes for controlling Codling Moth.

Last year I also made-up a mixture of Kaolin Clay and water and painted the trunks of all fruit trees up to the branches in the hope anything crawling up or down the trunk will be irritated and leave or better still die. It seemed to deter the ants, don't know about anything else.

At least we got some fruit protein free.

Leaf curl at our place is an ongoing problem, even after spraying twice with different chemicals suggested, and at the time suggested. I'm starting to think I'm going to have to look at an alternate way or ways to control.

If your raspberry plants are like mine and just leafing up, now is the time to give these plants a feed. As they are gross feeders they need a fertiliser rich in nitrogen e.g. Blood and Bone or if you have cats or dogs a multi fertiliser containing 10-10-10. A fertiliser containing 10 parts nitrogen, 10 parts phosphate and 10 parts potash. Don't be to heavy handed and don't place fertiliser to close to plant.

#### **Garden Vegetables**

The Broad Beans are nearly ready to pick. The Brassica plants were a failure with only very small heads forming.

#### **Flower gardens**

As mentioned in the September article our roses had been pruned rather severely, however they are starting to bud-up with Apricot Nectar a deep orange the first to bloom with Pope John Paul a white not far behind. However, Pope John Paul first bloom has a pink edge to it when its supposed to be pure white.

With the showers at night some roses are covered with black spot. Don't know what the answer or remedy to stop this problem. All I'm going to do is feed with different fertiliser and prune the centre out of the worst ones to allow more air flow into the plant.

The Corn Flowers have reached for the sky and are at least a meter tall and are just starting to flower with blues, white and pink so far.

Our Camellias are looking great with one red as large as a saucer. We found that during the drought the smaller leaf camellias didn't do so well where the larger leaf varieties did better. Actually, we are in the process of replacing the smaller leaf varieties. All of our camellias are on the Southern Side of our house. In the same bed as the camellias we have edged this bed with

With the warmer days and night all summer vegetables and flowers can be planted (we hope no more frost)

#### VEGETABLES to be planted;

Beans, both climbing and dwarf, carrots, beetroot, cabbage, silver beet, radish, parsnip, herbs, cucumber, squash, zucchini, pumpkin, capsicum, sweet corn, tomatoes, celery, lettuce.

#### FLOWERS;

Ageratum, aster, carnation, cosmos, dahlia, linaria, lobelia, marigolds, nasturtium, petunias, phlox, portulaca, snapdragon, verbena.

Amaranthus;- a very popular summer annual and makes a brilliant display with its 1m. highly colourful foliage, loves hot weather. Add compost and balanced fertilizer at the rate of 1/3 cup full per square metre.

Celosia; summer flowering plant, prepare the soil as for Amaranthus. Fairy Fountain is a dwarf variety, with plumes in scarlet, salmon, light pink, gold and yellow.

Also you can plant coleus, cosmos, gazanias, zinnia.

Roses; Check for any aphids, spray with Rose spray, also good for black spot.

Cherry Trees; Both fruiting and ornamental, can be attached by a cherry slug. This pest is a very small shiny black slug which sucks the leaves and leaves them transparent and having a burnt appearance. They are easy to control by using Malathion, Carbaryl or dust the tree with Cabbage Dust. You can also cover the leaves with lime. Cherry slug also affects, my Nashi Pear trees. Thing to do now;

Cut back ground-covering plants that are spreading onto the lawns.

Select and plant advanced annual flowers seedlings so they`ll be in bloom by Christmas.

Prune bottlebrush shrubs and trees after their main flowering to keep them tidy.

Set up pheromone traps for codling moth in apple and pear trees, and wrap corrugated cardboard around the trunk to catch migrating grubs.

Spread a compost mulch around growing vegetables to help keep the roots moist and cool during hot weather. Build up soil and mulch around the base of corn plants as they grow to encourage more roots and stability.

It's strange because for a good week when they were just born we had what looked like a Brown Falcon hang around our property but this fellow just tormented the chooks when out and about. Scared the crap out of them and each afternoon I had to go looking for them hidden in the long grass to scared to move.

#### Windellama Rural Fire Brigade

Windellama Rural Fire Brigade remains open during the COVID19 pandemic as we are an essential emergency service for our community. In an **emergency call Triple Zero (000)** 

#### **Brigade training**

The Windellama brigade highly values our regular training to ensure we do our best for the community as well as keeping things safe.

With Covid-19 restrictions we have not been able to run our own face-to-face training but our members have been using online training modules and attending regional training events. Members who were unable to attend many callouts last season have been able to remain current in their knowledge by undertaking the online Bushfire fighter training modules. Congratulations to the four members who will complete their Advanced Firefighting qualifications during November.

#### Get Ready now

Warmer weather has arrived but there is still time to Get Ready. It takes 5 minutes to make a plan that will give your property, your family and yourself the best chance of survival should you be threatened by a bush fire.

If there is a bush or grass fire in Windellama, you will find its alert level on the NSW RFS website at <u>www.rfs.nsw.gov.au</u>, on the radio and in the '**Fires Near Me'** app.

What will be your sign for putting your fire plan into action?

Advice – A fire has started. There is no immediate danger. Stay up to date in case the situation changes.

Watch and Act – There is a heightened level of threat. Conditions are changing and you need to start taking action now to protect you and your family.



*"Spring is sprung, the grass is riz I wonder where the boidies is?" (Anon).* 

Yes, spring is finally here, and everything is growing fast, thanks to the abundance of water and warmer temperatures. Our October meeting at Maria and Peter's, though, turned out to be on a cold, overcast day that had us inside for a large part of the proceedings.

Sadly, Peter had injured his leg, following a losing struggle with a large number of timber panels that he was trying to protect from the rain, which prompted one wit in the group to remark that no good deed ever goes unpunished. Still, Peter managed to complete a rather artistic glasshouse, adjoining their railway carriage. It's great to see things built that are both functional and creative.



Maria and Peter's garden continues to evolve, with Maria applying organic principles as much as possible, including mulching plants clippings, using organic treatments and generally improving the soil. The results are a flourishing, diverse and highly productive garden that produces lots of vegetable, flowers and ornamental plants which surrounds their house and outside buildings.

Of course, next door's cattle do their bit, as they like to camp under the surrounding trees and along the common fence-line and add to the soil fertility as only cattle can. When the wind is in the right direction, Peter and Maria assure us

that you can sense their contribution.

In other gardens, Margaret and Chris' bearded irises are starting to flower and their agapanthus are growing strongly. They are looking to develop their garden so that there is continuous flowering from early spring into summer. Members suggested hellebores, which flower very early in the season and aquilegias to complement the existing lavenders, bulbs and other plant species.

Dawn has put in four new wicking beds and erected a shed. Her peas, broad beans and other assorted vegies are growing well.

Carolyn and John's wisterias are in full flower and looking magnificent, their Japanese maples are shooting and everything is generally bursting forth. They have finished repairs to their vegetable screen-house, that was attacked by marauding animals (probably rabbits) last month, and hopefully there will be not more episodes of break-ins by hungry pests.

Kym has lots of wildflowers, egg-and-bacon bushes and native orchids in flower on his property, which he says is more rock than soil. Accordingly, he is constructing more garden beds and planting wormwood for the chickens, among other things. His roses are picking up after being fenced off from hungry predators.

Harry and Anne also have some hungry animal issues, and have needed to fence off their

The next AMSA shed development grant has just opened and we are considering what safety equipment or men's health information is still needed.

Fund raising is still on hold, but we went camping. Men, wives, partners, friends, dogs, etc, met at Micalong Creek campground on the Goodradigbee River near Wee Jasper on Monday 12 to Friday 16 September. Some stayed two nights and others longer. Noel Sylvester organised the trip with a special rate. Thanks and well done with the fantastic weather Noel. There were day



trips to nearby Wee Jasper, Goodradigbee river, the Hume & Hovell Fitzpatrick Trackhead and evening campfires with lots of stories. The campsite was grass and right alongside the creek. We also walked the 400m to the swimming hole and falls. Our resident bird expert assisted with identifying bird calls and sightings.

The Hume and Hovell Walking Track stretches over 440 kilometres between Yass and Albury. The track allows walkers to rediscover the route of explorers Hamilton Hume and William Hovell on their expedition to Port Phillip in

#### 1824.

The shed has now visited 2 of the 3 sites on this trail that are identified as 'track heads'. These are aimed at walkers, caravans and car campers. All have excellent facilities and are well maintained. This camp included a visit to the Fitzpatrick Trackhead and nearby caves. All the caves were closed due to Covid but we were able to peer into the abyss.

In March we visited the Thomas Boyd Trackhead. The only one that remains to be visited is the Henry Angel Trackhead. Perhaps this will be our next camp in March 2021? The Henry Angel Trackhead is a popular camping area with good facilities It is located around nine kilometres from the town of Tumbarumba on the Tooma Road. The camping area is a base for short and longer walks along the Hume and Hovell Track, especially walking up or downstream exploring Burra Creek and its significant mining history.

Hamilton Hume and William Hovell mounted an expedition in search of new grazing land for the colony. The journey, in the main funded by the two explorers, commenced at Lake George and finished at Corio Bay in Victoria. While the journey was considered a major success and one that greatly contributed to the founding of the city of Melbourne, the relationship between Hume and Hovell was a strained one and remained that way until their deaths approximately 50 years later.

#### **APPLICATIONS OPEN SOON FOR \$250 MILLION BUSHFIRE RECOVERY FUND**

Applications will open at the end of October for a \$250 million program to fund Bushfire Local Economic Recovery projects across New South Wales, including in Upper Lachlan, Goulburn-Mulwaree, Wollondilly and Wingecarribee local government areas.

Federal Member for Hume Angus Taylor said businesses and community groups in these fire affected areas can apply from 27 October 2020, with grants co-funded by the Australian and NSW governments.

"Recovery needs to be locally led, with money invested in the things that matter and that's what this Bushfire Local Economic Recovery program is all about," Mr Taylor said.

"Grants of between \$200,000 and \$20 million will be available to organisations such as councils, businesses, joint organisations, business chambers, charities, local Aboriginal Land Councils and state government agencies to deliver successful projects."

Additional to this open call for project proposals, shovel-ready projects are already being identified in bushfire affected areas so they can be fast-tracked to provide community and economic benefit as quickly as possible. Information about these projects will be released in coming weeks.

Overall, more than \$500 million joint funding from the Australian and NSW Governments will be provided to support projects driving local economic, community and industry recovery in bushfire affected communities.

Funding for Local Economic Recovery projects is just one of the initiatives supported by the Australian Government's National Bushfire Recovery Fund, which is worth more than \$2 billion. To date, more than \$1.8 billion in Australian Government support has been provided to help bushfire affected communities, including \$1.2 billion spent so far from the National Bushfire Recovery Fund.

Applications for Bushfire Local Economic Recovery funding open on 27 October 2020.
