Our community must object to plans for a massive waste incinerator at Tarago during the public exhibition period (26th October to 6th December). If you don't live in Tarago, you might think burning Sydney's garbage at Tarago won't hurt your family or your farm. But research shows a toxic waste incinerator will harm our whole region. Your future is at risk.

Toxic particulates (dioxins, PFAS, heavy metals) are pumped out the stack and end up in our soil, water and food.^{1,2} Did you know sheep show elevated levels of toxic incinerator pollutants in the lanolin layers of their wool more than 60km from an incinerator?¹ And how long will our bores and spring-fed dams and streams remain uncontaminated with 3 million tonnes of toxic incinerator ash stored in the ground at Woodlawn? 4. Remember you **must** state that you "**object**" to the proposal or your submission will be regarded as a 'comment'.

It's very important that you make an objection. Our whole region is at risk if this toxic waste incinerator goes ahead. Your objection can be as short or as detailed as you wish. Now with warmer days and nights, hopefully with out any frost.

VEGETABLES To plant now;

Beans, both climbing and dwarf. Carrots, beetroot, cabbage, silver beet, radish, parsnips, herbs, cucumber, squash, zucchini, pumpkins, capsicum, sweet corn, tomatoes(for a late crop) celery, lettuce.

FLOWERS;

Ageratum, aster, carnation, cosmos, dahlia, linaria, lobelia, marigolds, nasturtium, petunias, phlox, portulca, snapdragon, verbena.

Amaranthus, a summer flowering annual grows to 1m, loves hot weather.

Celosia, cockscomb, Coleus, (suitable as a pot plant in our climate. Grow them in a shade hose or glassed in verandah). Cosmos flowers grow to 1.5 m tall an excellent background , in colour mixture of red, pink and white. Seed can be sown directly into the soil.

Gazanias, good for rockeries, borders and banks. Zinnia, prefer warm days and nights to grow. With all flowers add compost to the soil to conserve moisture in the soil.

Roses, Check them for aphids, pinch off or hose them off, if lady bugs are about they eat the aphids.

Lawns can be fertilized now, water the fertilizer in well.

Cherry Trees; Both fruiting and ornamental, can be attacked by a cherry slug. This pest is a very small shiny black slug which sucks the leaves and leaves them transparent and having a burnt appearance. This also attacked pears trees. Cover the trees with lime this burns the slugs.

Pest alert; Codling moth in apples. This is a fruit-boring caterpillar is most serious pest of apples, pears, and other cool-climate fruit trees. The grub burrows into the fruit and emerge when fully fed to pupate under the bark or in other hidey-holes. Commercial traps are available, and home-made lures can be made using vinegar, water and molasses, or one of myriad recipes you can find on line. To trap migrating caterpillars, wrap some corrugated cardboard bands around the trunk and check them every few days.

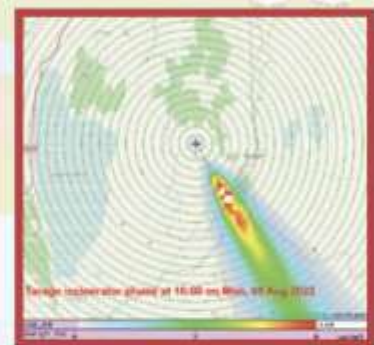

Thirdly you have the Rural Fire Service, as the name suggests, their core business is Fires.

Then comes the State Emergency Service and they have three areas of responsibility, which are, Floods, Storms and Tsunami.

THERE IS ONLY ONE NUMBER YOU NEED FOR THIS SERVICE AND THAT IS ONE THREE TWO FIVE HUNDRED (132500).

May I also point out that we supply SAND BAGS TO BE FILLED BY THE CUSTOMER or THEY CAN OBTAIN SAND FROM OUR UNIT AT WINDELLAMA. CONTACT NUMBER FOR THESE IS 132500.

We, at Windellama also have A COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDER SERVICE WHICH IS ACTIVATED BY THE AMBULANCE SERVICE AS REQUIRED. WE ARE, AS THE NAME SUGGESTS, FIRST RESPONDERS TO AN INCIDENT WHICH REQUIRES THE PRESENCE OF AN AMBULANCE.

THERE IS A GOOD WORKING RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE ABOVE SERVICES WHICH IS VERY WELL APPRECIATED BY ALL.

THERE ARE TELEPHONE NUMBERS FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO CAN BE CONTACTED IN SOME OF THE ABOVE SERVICES LISTED IN THE INFORMATION PAGE IN THE WINDELLAMA NEWS.

May I also point out that CANBERRA RADIO 666 IS THE EMERGENCY BROADCASTER FOR THE REGION.

I heard a very good quote the other day and it was, IF YOU DECIDE TO DRIVE THROUGH FLOOD WATER, IT MAY WELL BE THE LAST DECISION YOU EVER MAKE. There are FLOOD TECH'S WHO HAVE TO PUT THEIR LIVES AT RISK TO SAVE SOME THOUGHTLESS INDIVIDUAL.

Our CFR Team had to help an Ambulance out of a STICKY situation on the last callout. We are still having only CFR callouts. The usual flood watch still has to take place.

Please take care on our roads as they are in a pretty bad state of repair.

Windellama Garden Club Incorporated News

September 2022 Rainfall

At our place we received an additional drop of 44.5mm of rain. Total for September was 71mm.

October 2022 Rainfall

Rainfall up to the 18th of this month is a deluge of 111mm with more expected this month. While walking around the yard with gumboots on we are sinking up to our heels.

Fruit Trees

Now is the time to apply duct tape around tree trunks and apply horticulture grease to the tape. Just make sure you apply the tape glue side out. This procedure helps prevent pest from reaching the upper canopy.

It's also time to make Codlin Moth and Fruit Fly traps. Depending how big your trees are I hang at least 1 but most times up to 3 traps. I make holes in 1 litre plastic containers with a soldering iron. I used to make holes the size of a 5 cent piece and still do but the hole up on the shoulder near the lid I make it the size of a 50 cent piece. Doing this allows me to refill the trap without removing trap from tree.

The main bait for traps contains molasses, due to its longevity qualities.

Recipe: 1 Cup of Vinegar, ½ cup of Molasses, ¼ teaspoon of Ammonia and enough water to top up trap up to holes made. This amount is for 1 trap.

Using the ratio of this recipe as the bases of your bulk mixture, I make a watering can full – actually, initially, several watering cans full.

I check traps weekly and fill when required. Last year the fruit was protein free.

As our our fruit trees are in full bloom with some at the stage with the blossom on the verge of changing to fruit I try to delay hanging the traps for as long as I can because the bait in the trap is indiscriminate. That is, anything that enters, stays.

I mentioned a couple of old remedies to keep the rabbit pests away, like Blood and Bone and Human Hair placed near your trees or in your garden. Well I tried both but with the Blood and Bone the rain soaked it into the ground and the hair was taken by the birds nesting. I still think the best solution goes bang!

Vegetable Garden

This garden is still soggy and the paths between rows still look like small canals. It's surprising how some plants have responded. The Broad Beans that once again were self seeded in the same bed are nearly my height. Last year they were only about a metre high if that. The Global Artichokes are reaching for the sky and fruiting. Brassicas that sat all winter have powered on and are near ready to pick. Plantings of carrots and beetroot seed were a disappointment but radishes are doing fine.

Flower Gardens

Self seeded flowers are up and blooming with the Dutch Irises taller than ever as are the Granny Bonnets. Bulbs are a good investment as they multiply in numbers each year. I know you are supposed to lift them each year but I don't and so far the numbers are growing and each year the results are blooming good.

Bird Life

The past week we have had a pair of Grass Parrots checking out hollows. We normally have plenty of Crimson and Eastern parrots but the Grass Parrots have been absent for at least 7 years.

The majority of members have voted to make application for voluntary cancellation of registration of an association.

can also expect lots of insect damage as the weather warms up. If you are spraying for pests of any kind, get in early, as continuing showers make spraying very difficult. There is nothing worse than seeing your plants being eaten alive whilst the rain stops you from applying much needed protection.

Our October meeting was hosted by Sue. Although rain threatened earlier, on the day the weather turned out splendidly for us. It's al-



ways a pleasure to walk around Sue's extensive garden, complete with pest netting for the trees, a shade house for her many wicking beds and a heated glasshouse for those cold sensitive plants. The wicking beds are being re-planted with new crops and should be flourishing shortly. Her strawberries are starting to flower, the bulbs are still out and looking great, and the fruit trees are coming out of
