



Tried & True Recipe

Pickled Cucumbers

- 3 kilos cucumbers (about 9 cucumbers)
- 2 large onions
- 3 tablespoons cooking salt
- 2 teaspoons celery seed
- 2 teaspoons each yellow & black mustard seed
- 6 whole cloves
- 1 dessertspoon whole peppercorns
- 1/2 teaspoon turmeric
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1 pint white vinegar

Wash & slice cucumbers and onions thinly, cover with salt, leave overnight.

Drain off brine

Boil vinegar, sugar, spices. Add drained cucumber & onion.

Just bring up to the boil (do not let it boil) and remove from heat.

Cool and bottle.





Levelling of our Unit Site has finally started. Further to that, may I take the opportunity to remind all dwelling occupiers to make sure that their houses and ancillary building, rooves, gutters and downpipes are all free of debris, of whatever kind. There are two reasons for this, firstly, the storm season will soon be upon us, resulting in flooding into your ceiling space, the other reason is that the fire season is rapidly approaching, fire will quickly eventuate from the same problem. Remember that a ceiling can be replaced due to flooding, fire can result in a very much more serious consequence, so the onus is on you.

I know I have covered this subject before, but here it is again: we came across a vehicle recently that had been left unattended after having rolled on the edge of a main road. Two members of the S.E.S had to have the very unpleasant task of looking along the road to see if anybody was in an injured or worse state within a short distance of this vehicle.

Now the Fire Brigade member was in the same situation as were the Police who attended. Those who either vacate the scene on their own, or are transported for whatever reason, (other than by emergency personnel,) must leave some note, whether it be scrawled on part of the car, using lipstick or whatever, must be left to give the relevant authorities this vital information.

Ambo's and Police time costs you the taxpayer money, for us volunteers it costs us time, so why take advantage of us?

It is now up to all to show some courtesy in this regard.

We now at this time, have two local members attending C.F.R training with the Ambulance, good on them.

May I wish Cath, Rex & Andrew all the very best.





WINDELLAMA FARM

Following the successful excursion to the site of the travellers Rest Hotel last month I thought I would tell something about the land that the hotel was on.

This land, Portion 1 Parish Cullulla County Argyle was granted in November 1837 to Thomas Braidwood Wilson as an outstation for his extensive land holdings at Braidwood (hence the name) and at Lake George.



Thomas Braidwood Wilson was born 13 April 1792 in Scotland. He trained as a surgeon during the Napoleonic Wars. He made 9 trips to New South Wales on convict ships as surgeon. In 1827 he was promised land at present day Braidwood area that he called Braidwood Farm.

When the town was established on part of his land it took its name from his second name. He died in 1843.

An interesting snippet into his Windellama land can be found in the book, *The life and times of A Colonial Woman, Mary Braidwood Mowle* by Patricia Clarke.

Thomas Braidwood Wilson


An employee of Wilson was Samuel Rawson. When Rawson arrived in Australia in August 1838 Wilson sent a horse with the postman to meet Rawson at Bungonia. They intended to stay at Wilson's Windellama property before going on to Bungonia.

The Postman (a convict) was very drunk—we lost our way & lost the letter bags & it was not till near midnight that we reached Windellima—a common bush hut where an old man and his wife lived, belonging to Dr Wilson. The next morning all turned out to look for the letter bags—found all but one so we did not start till near noon & had 40 miles to go to Braidwood, which we reached about 8 p.m. I never told the Dr of our adventures the previous evening, if I had, the man would have been flogged. I became very popular in consequence among the convicts. Dr Wilson had a nice house & a large establishment some 70 convicts & probably as many free men besides 12 or 15 000 sheep & great numbers of cattle & horses.

EXPRESSION OF FEELINGS IN EARLY CHILDHOOD – Cont. Part (II)

Stage 5: Emotional Thinking:

When children reach the emotional thinking stage they go past labelling a feeling, they become able to think with these images starting to connect an idea and a feeling and recognising that one is causing the other e.g. they might say "I'm angry today because you didn't come and play with me".

At this stage children start to make the distinction between fantasy and reality. They understand more about what is coming from inside them and what influences are external to them. Children who find it difficult to process the information they are hearing find it much easier to live in their own private world. Greenspan and Salmon (1995) have found these children are usually very dramatic but when asked a difficult question they tend to ignore the question and retreat further into their own fantasies, compromising their emotional thinking.

Stage 6: The Age of Fantasy and Unlimited Power:

This is the stage when children from the age of four and a half to seven years develop their abilities to relate, communicate, imagine and think. They have a curiosity about life and a deep sense of wonder about the world. It is the stage where they may start to express themselves fearlessly.

Greenspan and Salmon (1995) have named this stage as the "world is my oyster". There is a great sense of magic and little boys may imagine themselves to be a Ninja Turtle or a power ranger, while little girls may imagine themselves to be Cinderella or Barbie. The relationship they have with their parents and others around them helps to develop greater emotional flexibility allowing them to work out complicated feelings without volatile outbursts.

This is also the time where children may become fearful. For example, they may worry about ghosts or have bad feelings concerning being kidnapped. In a child who is oversensitive to sound or touch, the fearful side of life can be overwhelming.

If all goes well at this stage children start to understand what reality is, while at the same time still having a degree of fantasy and unlimited power. They have a better understanding of more complicated relationships and become more emotionally stable e.g. they develop a capacity for more "adult" emotions such as guilt or empathy (although empathy is easily lost when they are feeling jealous or competitive). Having all these abilities helps children move out into the wider world.

The Different Personality Traits in Children

A child's personality is not simply a product of nature and nurture but a product of the continuous interplay between nature and nurture. Greenspan and Salmon (1995) state that "this interplay happens between children and their parents". For example, parents nurture their child with warmth and love which interacts with the child's nature, a new pattern of interaction is created. This new form of relationship helps children to develop the warmth and confidence they need.

A child's temperament (nature) is considered to be what they are born with. If a child has a difficult temperament they can be faced with a great deal of challenges throughout their life. These children tend to sleep less and are more demanding and impulsive. Although the child's temperament can stay with them to some extent and shape their personality it can be modified a great deal by the way they are loved (nurture). For example, if children are brought up in a nurturing environment and able to express their feelings whether sad or happy, they tend to have a smoother road than children who are brought up in a stressful or neglectful environment (Cooper, 2006).

In Your October Garden

From Irene Turner



Spring has sprung, Plums should have flowered. This month Pears and Apple are in blossom.

VEGETABLES

Seeds- Cucumber, zucchini, melons (watermelons & rockmelons), Pumpkins, Squashes, Parsley, capsicums, and sweet corn.

Sweet corn always sow in blocks to help with pollen from the male flowers or tassels at the top of the plant falling on the female

flower. Space the rows 60cm apart. When sweet corn is growing well apply a side dressing of nitrogen fertilizer and again as the top tassel start to form. Sweet corn also makes a good windbreak for the smaller vegetables such as lettuce and dwarf beans.

Pumpkins are companion planting for sweet corn.

Tomatoes can be planted after the long weekend, but keep cover because we can still have frost. If you get your tomatoes started put them in a pot in a sheltered place or front veranda until the frost are over.

Beans and celery can also be planted. Watch celery for snails.

FLOWERS

Seedlings – Ageratum, alyssum (sweet alice), asters, balsam, carnations, cosmos, dianthus, gypsophila, larkspur, linaria, lobelia, livingstone daisy, marigolds, nasturtiums, pansy, petunias, phlox, schizanthus, portulaca, verbena.



Dahlia- dwarf seedling grow to 60cm in height and come in colours, of yellow, reds, and pinks. They are ideal for cut flowers and they don't require staking,

The seedling form a tuber which can be replanted next year.

The taller dahlias such as Decorative, cactus and water lily can be grown from a tuber. Tubers can be kept from year to year, when the dahlia have died down, preferably after they have been burnt by the frost, dig up the

clumps with a fork and store them in a box covered with soil or damp sawdust in a shed where there is plenty of good ventilation but out of a draught. You can leave them in the ground if the soil does not get too water logged. The taller dahlia needs to be staked. Like all plants dahlias thrive in a moist soils providing a lot of compost is dug into it. As the

plants start growing, a side dressing of complete fertilizer, also a water soluble fertilizer used over the foliage every month will ensure plenty of blooms.



Bulbs - When spring bulbs have finished flowering this month, feed them with a complete fertilizer, this assists the bulbs for

next year's flowers. Do not cut off the leaves on the daffodils or jonquils, let them die down naturally this help with next years flowers.



PEST WATCH

Azalea petal blight is turning azalea flowers brown. Treat with the fungicide Zayleton as the buds are starting to colour. After flowering, remove dead blooms to reduce the spread of disease.

Aphid patrol should be in full swing as these pest move in to infest soft sappy growth on roses, garlic and fruit trees. Squirt with horticultural oil spray or soap or squish with your fingers.

Clean out your fireplace and put wood ash around plants that slugs infest - they will become coated in the ash and expire. Put any leftover ash onto your peonies, together with cow manure for good November blooms.

Watch for fungal problems on roses and grapevines. On roses, black spot and powdery mildew can indicate lack of air circulation. Spray with full cream milk diluted one part milk to 10 parts water, or use an ecologically friendly fungicide based on potassium bicarbonate.


