ABOUT BUSH SCHOOLS.

It would be almost "another injustice to Ireland" to compare such slab shells as are the buildings called schools at Jacqua, Windellama West, and Rosevale with the hedge schools of the evergreen isle.

By mental measurement I am sadly sure the country child does not receive his cubical allowance of air inside the school, but this deficiency of contents in the building is amply compensated by the entrance of fresh air and exit of the damaged article through crack and crevice between the slabs; and when the "wind whistles cold "neither teacher nor scholar has any complaint to make about the foulness of the air. In latrinal accommodation they are sadly deficient, but in the article "playground," the should-be, and now soon will-be, green-covered earth, with its freedom from vile smells or

pestilent odours, the country scholar has clearly a treat advantage over the town boy. But hold hard here, if you please, for I find the department has not been entirely neglectful in expending money upon schoolhouses in the bush. Eu route to Tarago not long since I came suddenly upon a school and master's residence so hidden by the bush itself, and so like a gentleman's substantially - built lodge, that the words " public school " positively surprised me. Whence the cause of this extravagance for such it really amounts to, in thy

favour, oh I Bronte in the bush? The scholars who attend this handsome school must come from far, for near there seemed to be nothing but the bush and the church, and the latter seemed plain indeed beside the school. About the school and residence there appeared to be everything the department could supply, even to a fully-rigged bell on a strong post in the playground. The cost of this one school would, I imagine, have. sufficed to make comfortable several such poverty-stricken looking " schools " as I have seen within a radius of ten miles. To draw the necessary material into position must have been a very laborious and consequently

expensive item, while the number of hours, at eight per diem, multiplied by the number of men, would doubtless make many eyes stare at the cost of labour alone. If those things have been got for Bronte, why not for Rosevale. Never mind the why and wherefore.



Windellama Garden Club Incorporated News

July Rainfall

At our place we received an extra drop 33mm giving us a total of 58.5mm for the month. The best July rain for sometime.

August Rainfall

August has seen the heavens open up, with 183.5mm so far at our place. For this year we have received a total of 654mm at an average of 81.75 per month. This has been the best since I started recording in 2014.

On the Friday 7th to Sunday 9th we received 141.5mm that caused the lake to establish at the rear of our place but by the Monday 10th morning you would wonder where all the water went!

Fruit Trees

When we planted the fruit trees and vines we planted them all on mounds. Just as lack of water can

have trees and vines turn their toes up, so can to much water by drowning them.

Garden Vegetables

The garden area at this stage is a bit of a quagmire, so very little is being done. The self sown Broad Beans are now over a metre tall and covered in flowers. Fingers crossed that most of the flowers set loaded pods.

Flower gardens

The Azaleas we have in pots are looking good, nice and green with flowers. So far the Red Spider has not found them yet and nor has Petal Blight.

Treatment for Spider Mite consist of keeping the area around the bush free of rubbish, that is, good garden hygiene. Also, Insecticidal Spays and Horticultural Oil sprays are suppose to work but I haven't had much luck with them. We have been keeping the plants healthy and hope.

This year we are going to try and introduce some Predatory Mites that can be purchased from Garden Centres for this problem. Also, will be looking at using Predatory Mites to control various pests on the fruit trees – can only try as most times, nothing Else works!

For the Petal Fungal problem you can try a copper based spray. The problem with this fungal problem is, it's hard to determine if it is fungal originating or the wind is causing it.

Bird Life

The magpies are nesting but this year instead of their normal site high in the gumtree the nest site this year is two thirds up in a Laylarnie Pine. This is giving their nesting site plenty of cover all round and on top of the nest. Does this mean plenty of rain? Or wind? Or hot weather? Or all three weather elements?

Cake Auction.

As previously mentioned, at this stage this annual event held in August will not be happening. If this Covid virus abates, then maybe we will hold it latter in the year – maybe!

This is the month most of our fruit tree are in bloom. Let hope the frost is over.

VEGETABLES

Sow seeds of;- carrots, parsnips, beetroot, peas, cabbage, silver beet, radish, Also cucumber, Marrows, zucchini, Melons, pumpkins, squash.

Parsley, grow next to a tap as it requires a damp soil, feed regular with water soluble fertilizer If it dries out the plant will go to seed.

Capsicum, sweet corn and also tomatoes, you may have to cover tomatoes f we get a late frost. Beans.

Celery it is a heavy feeder, needing lime, a very fertile soil and regular watering. When plants start to grow well a side dressing of sulphate of ammonia and plenty of water will ensure a good crop.

FLOWERS

Sow seeds of;- Agertum, alyssum, asters, balsam. Carnations, cosmos.

Dahlia can be purchased in seedling form, mainly dwarf varieties, they grow to 60cm in height and come in colours of yellow, reds and pinks. The seedling form a tuber which can be replanted next year.

The taller dahlias such as decorative, cactus and water lily can be purchased as tubers. There is a wide range of colours. Tubers can be kept from year to year. If the soil is wet after the frost you can lift and store the bulbs, cover with saw dust. Place stakes when planting the tubers.

Dianthus, gypsohila, larkspur, linaria, lobelia, liverstone daisy, margolds nasturtium, pansy, petunias.

Bulbs- When spring flowering bulbs such as hyacinthus, daffodils, jonquils, ranunculus and anemone finished flowering, do not remove the leaves, let them die down naturally.

Prune wisteria and other spring bloomers immediately after they have finished flowering.

Cut back native hibiscus by two=thirds after flowering, and feed with blood and bone.

Pick off and bin rotten and mildew blooms on plants such as sweet peas, stock, azalea and dianthus.

Remove small fruit forming on ornamental spring blossom trees so they don't become hosts for fruit fly.

Divide and replant bearded iris after the flowers fade, ensuring the top of the rhizome is exposed to the sun.

Pour boiling water over weeds that are popping up between pavers.



Windellama Rural Fire Brigade

Windellama Rural Fire Brigade remains open during the COVID19 pandemic as we are an essential emergency service for our community. In an emergency call Triple Zero (000)

Windellama Brigade Preparations

Bushfire Pre-season Maintenance day at the Windellama Rural Fire Brigade Station last month saw a great turnout of 11 members who washed, cleaned, checked and restocked all the trucks ready for fire season, removed the leaf litter from our carpark area, fixed the flagpole at our memorial wall, filled our station water tank and cleaned up a few dead trees around the station.

Bush Fire Danger Period has commenced

The Bush Fire Danger Period commenced 1 October 2020 and runs to 31 March 2021. If you are planning to light a fire in the open during this time, you will need a Fire Permit.

A permit is not automatic and in many cases one will not be issued. Factors such as your preparation, the topography for the burn, availability of fire suppression equipment, the expected weather and the potential to wait until the Bush Fire Danger Period is over.

The Permit may have additional conditions but will have these standard conditions:

- the permit is to be carried by the permit holder, on site, at the time the fire is lit
- the permit is to remain on site with those present until extinguished,
- the fire must be supervised at all times
- notifications are given to the NSW RFS, and adjoining neighbours at least 24 hours prior to the fire being lit and
- the permit may be varied, cancelled or suspended, depending on weather conditions
- substantial fines and prison terms of up to 12 months may apply to persons found to be in breach of the Rural Fires Act 1997 and its Regulations.



September's meeting of the garden club was held at Rob and Robyn's. The meeting was initially planned to be held at Lynda's new house in Crookwell but Lynda caught a cold a few days before the meeting and, fearing a possible covid19 attack, quite sensibly got herself tested and withdrew from hosting the meeting. Happily, Lynda's test confirmed she did not have the dreaded virus and she was able to come along.



John arrived with his arm in a sling, thanks to his recent operation on his shoulder. His arm and shoulder are going well, and it appears that the operation was a complete success. Still, no more racing car driving for a little while at least.

Turning to members reports, common themes were rain and weeds. Since the drought earlier in the year was broken, at least in our area, there has been plenty of rain. Rob and Robyn's place has not dried out all winter, and Rob is not game to get his tractor out most of the time lest

it gets bogged. Harry said that Reedy Creek had flooded and he even lost his canoe downstream.

Of course, lots of rain and the warmer weather means lots of growth both in gardens and elsewhere. Most members reported strong weed growth just about everywhere, with cape weed being a major problem. Fortunately the wanted plants are also doing very well with most members reporting strong performances in their gardens and trees.

Kym's passionfruit is flowering and attracting swarms of bees. Lynda's agapanthus have collapsed over winter, but we all assured her that they will rise again in the warmer weather. Meanwhile her grape hyacinths are in full bloom and her vegetable garden is going well.

Judy and Warren's vegetable garden and bulbs have taken on the spring spirit. Their snow and snap peas are growing vigorously, as are the curly kale, silverbeet, lupins and cabbages. They plan to plant a variety of dahlias, gladiolas and bulbs shortly.



Sue is harvesting her potatoes and will be assured of a future crop as the smaller potatoes are currently shooting. Her salvias, which she has kept in pots, are now ready to be planted. Sue's broccoli is flowering, the poppies are up and running and her glasshouse in nearly finished.

CRAFT, ART, PRODUCE SEASONAL (CAPS) MARKET IN TARAGO

nice veggie party.



Wandering around Rob and Robyn's developing garden, there were signs of new growth after the devastation of the previous summer, where the drought and the wingless grasshoppers exacted a heavy toll on their planting of the previous spring. One mysterious plant that has popped up, a bulb with yellow flowers, caused much speculation as to the variety which no-one recognised.

Rob and Robyn's decision to spray with a selective herbicide against the worst flat leaf weeds over winter has been rewarded, as most of the weeds are dying or at least are not setting seed. The grass hidden underneath is now starting to grow vigorously as the weather warms. Of course there is still much to do as the paddocks are a blaze of yellow as the cape weed comes into flower.

The ornamental maples are doing surprisingly well and appear to like the conditions, but a couple of the pepper

trees have succumbed to the winter frost.

The addition of lime around some of the plantings appears to have had a good effect. The soil pH is only about 4.5, so plants that don't like strongly acid soil are struggling, but at least the camellias and crab apples are doing fine.

Our next meeting will be in October and we will no doubt hear tales of much growth and blooming as the warmer weather sets in. The next challenge will be insect attack, as the warmth brings out a diverse array of pests to predate our precious plantings. At least this year we are approaching summer will full water tanks and well hydrated gardens.


