
** Goulburn Storytime has been cancelled for ** Tuesday 5th September only.





Vale Ernest Leonard Haylan

Our dear Grandpa, Ernest Leonard Haylan, 'Len', was born in Woodstock on August 7, 1917 and died August 1, 2006 in his 89th year.

He was the fourth of eight children of Edward William and Sarah Jane Haylan, having 3 brothers and 4 sisters. The family lived at Woodstock and grandpa attended Woodstock and Blossom Vale public schools. Blossom Vale was a small school of about 12 students. He played football for Woodstock and has always had a passion for the game. After leaving school at age 14 he worked as a farmhand in Woodstock and then as a contract worker.

In 1941 at Kempsey NSW Grandpa enlisted in the Australian Army and served in the 106th Australian Tank Attack Regiment in New Guinea. He served his country proud and in 1946 left the Australian Army.

Grandpa met his loving wife, our grandma Nancy Barton at St. Marys, where both their families lived, and in 1951 they were married. They had three children, two sons Bruce, our father Daryl, and a daughter Glenda, of whom they are very proud.

In 1959 Grandpa drew a soldiers settlers block at Tarago. They built a home and established the farm that is 'Kywong'. Life was never easy at Kywong but Grandpa never complained and faced every hardship head on. They watched their children grow there and have many happy memories of their life on the farm and married life together for the past 55 years.

Grandpa lived on the farm until 2004 when he retired and purchased a nice home in Harden on a large block, where he enjoyed his gardening and shared his vegetables with family and neighbours.

We have fond memories of Grandpa and his farm he was so proud of. Helen helping plant the trees that are now so tall; collecting pine cones for Grandpa to start the fire; collecting eggs; (shearing season was one of my favourite times and I was probably more of a hindrance than help); riding on the back of the truck through the paddocks; checking the boundary fences on his motorbike. Grandpa would read us the messages the fairies had written on the 'squiggly gums' and watching his beloved South Sydney play football. But most of all we remember at the end of the day when the work was done he would sit on the back verandah overlooking the paddocks and have a cold Tooheys.

Uncle Bruce now runs Kywong and has made Grandpa so happy knowing that the farm is in such good hands.

Grandpa in his last days told us of dreams he had of being on the farm again, his memory will be with us for the rest of our lives.

As we lay him to rest we honour our dear Grandpa.
