VEGETABLES



Seeds; to plant now, Carrots, parsnips, silver beet, onions, cabbage, radish, Kohlrabi, peas, beetroot.

Potatoes; In our climate, planting is from September to December as soon as the worst of the frosts are over. They adapt to either light or heavy soils but need good drainage. The tubers(or seed potatoes) are planted 15cm. deep and 75 cm. apart. Apply a good handful of compost , and if you haven't limed, a handful of lime per square metre. If you are

worried about late frost cover the potatoes with shade cloth or frost cloth when leaves emerge.

I like to grow potatoes, to improve the soil, in a garden that has been growing lots of green, or to break up the soil.

FLOWERS

Plant seedling of viola, verbena, dianthus, carnations, stock wallflower, dwarf sweet William, nemesia, polyanthus, and for early summer display petunias and phlox.

The bulb of gladioli can now be planted. They like a garden containing compost and plenty of sun and good drainage. Gladioli from the time of planting takes about 90 days to flower. If your soil is heavy, plant the bulbs, 12cm. deep or if light and sandy 20cm. deep. You may have to stake them in sandy soil.

Chrysanthemums; This flower which originated in Japan always reminds us of Mother`s Day and this is the time of the year to purchase them from your local nursery. You can plant your potted plant into the garden now. Cuttings can be take now, should be about 8cm. long and placed in a pot of coarse sand mix 2 to 1 of potting mix. They should strike in 2-3 weeks. Once established they can be planted into the garden. Well established clumps ca also be divided during September.



If the weather is very wet, chrysanthemums can be affected by fungus disease. The bottom leaves may turn brown and drop off and the top leaves show signs of black spot. Spray them with Benlate.

Fertilise shrubs by sprinkling organic-based pellets over the root area and watering well.

Divide and re-pot crowded cymbidium orchids.

Prune bottlebrush stems just below the spent flower head as soon as the blooms brown off.

Give newly planted summer annuals a fortnightly application of liquid fertilizer to speed up growth.

July 2022 Rainfall

At our place we received an additional drop of 25.5mm given us a total drop of 76mm for the month.

The total yearly rainfall at our place to the end of July is 660.5 mm, 50.5mm more than last year. With another wet 6 months predicted I suppose the only benefit will be that you should not have to purchase water.

August 2022 Rainfall

So far up to the 18th of this month we have received 47mm and its still gumboot time.

Cold Weather

Twice this month we have received rain at night and woken up to a big frost.

Fruit Trees

Now is the time to feed all fruit trees that are budding up. The easy way to do this is to give them a feed of poultry pellets at the recommended rate. The only exception to this is any citrus you have growing.

With citrus it is safer to wait to the last frost has occurred before feeding and at our place this is usually after Melbourne Cup Day. In the meantime a drink of seaweed extract helps. This year because of the cold, combined with wet weather I will be feeding a complete citrus feed mix combined with Dolomite. About a month latter a feed of pelleted poultry fertiliser will be applied. As always, apply fertilisers at the recommended rates.

Last year due to not having any luck with Blue Berries I planted 3 in large pots. The results were good as they supplied a steady flow of berries. This year the plants have doubled in size and are already flowering, so expectations are high with more berries.

Vegetable Garden

This garden is still soggy and recently I purchased some wild Rice grains to plant. With all the future rain predicted I should get a good crop.

All the beds have been weeded and raised at least 100mm and currently waiting for them to settle before planting. But before I plant a ph test of all beds will occur. If the acidity or alkalinity of your soil is not right for what you are planting results can be disappointing. The only exception is sometimes self seeded seedlings.

Flower Gardens

I have noticed that my roses are budding up so its time to get finger out and prune. I always prune to an upside down umbrella shape. I always remove all dead or diseased wood first, then remove the centre and prune to height required.

To make the job easy always have sharp tools, sanitise between each bush to prevent the spread of disease and once pruning is completed fertilise. I don't spray for Black Spot any more as I found I still got Black Spot. Much better results were achieved by fertilising on a regular basis and selecting Roses that have some resistance to Black Spot.

Bird Life

Our residential Magpies have sorted themselves out and have paired up, the birds of spring have arrived like our Thrushes who has claimed squatters right in the same hanging pot as previous years.

The pair of Bower Birds are here but the male has not coloured up yet.

Meeting

We continue to discuss future direction.

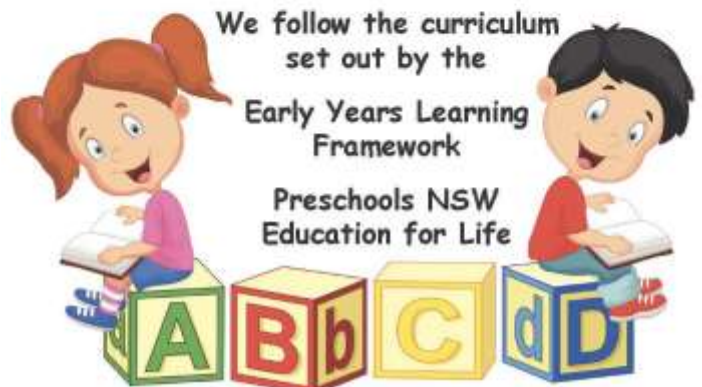

The new 4 level fire danger rating system - issued only on days when there is a fire risk:

- Moderate - Plan and prepare
- High - Be ready to act
- Extreme - Take action now to protect your life and property
- Catastrophic - For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas



Brigade Activities

Even with mild conditions for firefighting our members have still been busy helping the community. In total, we provided over 140 hours of assistance in August; and that doesn't include the hours members put into training and maintaining our equipment ensuring we're ready to respond 24/7.

Cultural Burn

Four firefighters, Murray, Doug, Matt and Peter assisted Bungonia Brigade with a cultural burn. With wet conditions only small firefighting appliances were deployed with firefighters on foot.

Grass Fire

Brendan and Tom responded to a call for assistance in blacking out a grass fire in high winds at Bungonia. High winds and frost dry grasses out quickly making for dangerous fire conditions.

Varroa Mite

We deployed two members for a week each to assist [NSW DPI Biosecurity](#) with the ongoing Varroa Mite response in the Hunter Valley. Tom and Kym joined strike teams from the Southern Tablelands working with DPI Officers and Apiarists in surveillance and eradication of the parasite.

INTERNATIONAL REPORT

The people of the Baltic countries moved onto their current areas about 4000 years ago and are now one of the oldest continuously settled countries in Europe.

They have maintained their occupancy against invaders from both the east and the west. In mediaeval times there was a Northern Crusade which attempted to Christianise the Baltic countries but only had limited success. Today there is still a strong connection with the old Mother Earth religious beliefs. In the 1600's Sweden invaded Riga, the Capital of Latvia. In the same decade Latvia had colonised other areas in southern Europe.

Through the studies of languages it has been found that the languages of Latvia and their southern neighbours Lithuania originated from the Indo-European groups of people. Their northern neighbours in Estonia share a language origin with Finland and Lapland. It is understandable that the cultural groups and languages within Latvia have many regional variations across a geographically small country.

The one hectare site of the Shoalhaven Heads Native Botanic Garden packs a lot in with a thoughtful design, paths and grassed areas.

Major planting of shrubs took place in September 2010. Many other plantings have been added since then, emphasising endangered, rare and unusual Australian native plants. Across the road from the garden is a planting devoted to Western Australia plants.

As we enjoyed the sun dappling through the overhead canopy of leaves from figs, gums, palms and some rather large bottlebrush and grevilleas, we wandered down paths packed with tree ferns, paper daisies, various art works of all mediums and peered at the all the signposted plants. There were re-plantings of some of the garden beds, they have had a very wet couple of seasons too so trying different shrubs and other types of plants in the ground is encouraging to see. The garden was laid out quite carefully creating little micro climates which would be difficult to replace in our cold and windy environment. Seeing Wollemi pines side by side Gymea and Giant Spear Lilies then the Davidson Plum which was a curiosity as its fruit grows from the bark of the tree not off a branch like traditional fruit.

We had morning tea at the garden over on the West Australian planting side, discussing our own gardening woes mainly weeds and the lack of opportunity to catch up on the winter tasks of pruning, weeding and spraying. The group went on then to an enjoyable lunch around the corner which was at the Shoalhaven Bowling Club,

We have welcomed more new faces to our recent meetings, as everyone is always welcome. If you would like to come along, contact us through Warren and Judy Yates

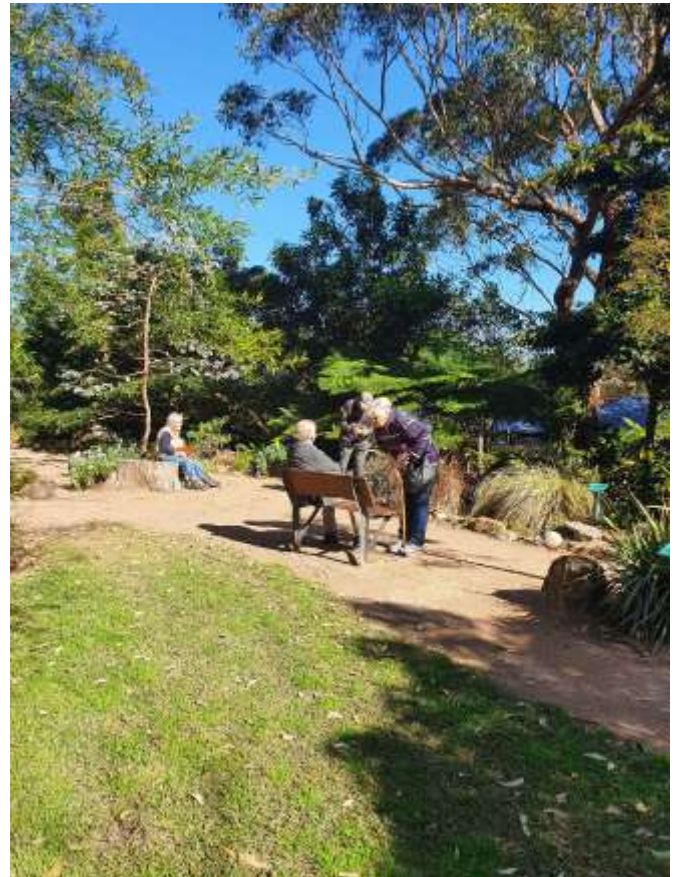
