Bushfire Danger period

It is expected that the Bush Fire Danger Period will commence 1 October 2021. If you are planning to light a fire in the open during this time, you will need a Fire Permit. A permit is not automatic and in many cases one will not be issued. Factors such as your preparation, the topography for the burn, availability of fire suppression equipment, the expected weather and the urgency to burn rather than to wait until the Bush Fire Danger Period is over. To apply for a permit contact our local NSW RFS Fire Control Centre on 6226 3100.

July 2023 Rainfall at our place

Moisture collected in the rain gauge up to the end of July has been made up of the same weather elements Dew, Mist, Frost and a few drops of Rain as for the first half of July. A further drop of 1.5mm was collected, giving us a total of 11.5mm. Low rainfall events for July was also recorded in 2018 6.5mm. Lets all hope that we do not follow the heat wave trends over seas!

August 2023 Rainfall at our place

Rainfall at our place up to the 18th of this month has seen 22.5mm collected.

Our dam that is supposed to be spring fed is now way lower than the spillway. The recent rainfall saw very little end up in the dam as there was no run off. Instead the surrounding soil areas went slurp, thank you for the drink. We are going to need at least 30mm or more in one down pour to top it up. This year I have already pumped 1100 litres of water to the cattle tank twice in the last 5 months.

Soil Conditioners

Even though, compost is good for the garden it still pays to check the pH of what you are adding and then again after a few weeks. If the pH is up around 8 (alkaline) a darker purple if using a pH test kit or 8 if using a meter, some plants/bushes like tomatoes don't grow so well. I find at our place tomatoes do well when the soil has a pH around 6-6.5. Some compost pH are acidic with a pH of 4.5 – 6 and plants/bushes like Blueberries do better at pH 4.5 – 5.

However, my motto is if plants are self sown and germinate and grow well in your soil, then leave well enough alone. For the last few years, at least seven or more, I have not purchased Silver Beet seeds/ seedlings as we normally have seedlings popping up here there and every where. It's the same with the flower Calendulas seedlings. This year a carrot plant was left to seed and drop its seed and we have the best crop of carrots ever. The last 3 years saw Broad Beans self seed in the same garden bed and crop heavily. So, in the Broad Bean case, there is also the situation where crop rotation was not used and grew well but maybe, it is because I add something each year to each garden bed and that is why they still grew well?

Jobs for the month at our place

Now is the time to start setting up your fruit fly and codling moth traps. Also, banding the trunks of all fruit trees.

I'm not convinced, exact measurements of different fruit fly bait mixes are needed but all that is needed are the ingredients. I found last year that molasses worked well as did some over the counter baits. Same with traps for codling moth.

Its also time to fertilise trees with appropriate fertiliser. If in doubt, chicken manure pellets combined with dolomite will get you out of trouble. The ratio of chicken manure to dolomite I use is one 850 gram can of chicken manure pellets to 400 grams of dolomite. I have 2 buckets, in one bucket I put 5 cans of pellets and in the other 5 cans of dolomite at the ratio for each above. When applying these 2 products I apply chicken manure pellets to opposite sides of trees and the other 2 sides dolomite. As we have all fruit trees growing in a hedge form about 30 meters long, I apply about a handful of manure pellets to a square meter each side of tree and half that amount of dolomite to the other sides of tree.

If you have not done so, get the pruning gear sharpen up and prune your roses.

Bird Life

As we near the end of winter the variety in bird life increases. The male Crested Pigeons have started their courtship routine with the females with head bobbing and cooing. The Thrush, that visits every year has been spotted carrying bits of grass and small twigs. I wonder what hanging pot this year has been settled on?

Our Community First Responders Need You!!

Have you ever had to call an ambulance for yourself or a loved one? When you need urgent medical care in our area, the first people who arrive to help will often be our SES Community First Responders. Trained to provide medical assistance until paramedics arrive, Community First Responders play a vital role in our community. But many of our First Responder volunteers are getting older, and we desperately need new volunteers to make sure people get the help they need in a medical emergency.

Each Community First Responder completes comprehensive advanced first aid training. Following this, volunteers also complete one theory session at home each month (with a break over December/January). The theory sessions are done online and are followed up by a training day on the 4th Saturday of each month where volunteers meet to practice the practical components. The in-depth training means volunteers can be confident in their ability to provide care until an ambulance arrives.

Community First Responders always work in pairs. This allows new volunteers to gain confidence with the support of an experienced and well-trained partner. First Responder volunteers also work on a roster to respond to call-outs as required. You might be called to help a child with a broken bone, attend a traffic or farming accident, or assist someone having an asthma attack. The role is varied, and as Irene says (an experienced volunteer of more than 15 years) “your main role is to assist the patient and provide reassurance to the families”.

Anyone who volunteers to become a Community First Responder will be given comprehensive training, but there are a few qualities that will help you in the role. Volunteers should:

- * Be willing to assist when someone is in need;
- * Able to devote time for training and to respond to callouts;
- * Committed to completing the training requirements; and
- * Have a vehicle and driver’s licence.

In August the NSW Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) again issued Veolia with licence infringement fines, this time for a grand total of \$30,000. The two \$15,000 infringements were for leaking containers that were reported to the EPA in November 2022 and March 2023.¹ It's good to know that the EPA is taking community reporting seriously.

Now we all know that Veolia's corporate headquarters could blow their nose on \$30,000 and never notice the difference. But in the fight against the incinerator, these fines help build the mountain of evidence that demonstrates how totally unsuitable Veolia is to manage the hazardous operations of an industrial waste incinerator.

Can't keep the Woodlawn dams from overflowing² = Likely can't guarantee hazardous incinerator ash stored in their dams won't run into the surrounding environment.

Can't keep your containers watertight¹ = Likely can't build a leak-proof containment cell for hazardous incineration ash.

Can't fix the stench³ = Likely can't guarantee the incinerator won't stink.

Can't obey your operating licence^{1,2,3} = Likely can't obey the government's emissions limits.

Even operated 100% within its licence conditions, Veolia's proposed incinerator would still present a huge danger to the health and safety of our community and our environment. And licence breaches will mean highly hazardous chemicals and deadly emissions are released into the air, soil and water around us. \$30,000 will never clean that up.

But every fine Veolia receives, and every report that demonstrates how Veolia is not meeting its licence conditions **IS** evidence that our community can use to fight the incinerator. When the Independent Planning Commission makes its decision to approve or reject the incinerator, they'll be doing so in the face of all this evidence that demonstrates Veolia's inability to stick to its licence conditions.

So if you see it, smell it, or get your windscreen coated in it, **please** make sure you report it to the EPA. Send them an email at info@epa.nsw.gov.au or phone 131555 and select option 1. Every report helps make sure your family, friends and neighbours won't be breathing air and drinking water polluted by a toxic waste incinerator.

This is the month to get your gardens ready for spring, by adding composed or well decomposed animal manure to both your vegetables and flower gardens.

VEGETABLES SEED

Carrots, parsnips, lettuce, silver beet, onions, cabbages, radish, Kohlrabi, peas, beetroot. You can plant potatoes, but cover the leaves if a frost is about.

FLOWERS

This month plant seedlings of violas, verbena, dianthus, carnations, stock, wallflower, dwarf sweet William, nemesia, polyanthus, and for early summer display petunias and phlox.

The bulbs of gladioli can now be planted. They like a garden containing compost and plenty of sun and good drainage. Gladioli from the time of planting takes about 90 days to flower. If your soil is sandy plant at 20cm deep and you may have to stake the plants. A light dressing of a complete fertilizer when planting will ensure large healthy flowers.

You can plant new lawns now, make sure you have removed all the weeds first. Rake over the soil after applying a light dressing of sand, and water in well.

Establish Lawns

This month you will see signs of new growth and lots of weeds. There are a number of chemicals to spray for broadleaf weeds, and bindii. Before spraying give the lawn a good watering.

Chrysanthemums; This flower which originated in Japan always reminds us of Mother's Day and this is the time of year to purchase them from your local nursery. Chrysanthemums will grow in almost any type of soil, but avoid animal manure. Compost is beneficial to the plants plus plenty of sun and good drainage. You can take cutting at this time of the year.

It time to;

Lightly prune westringa to encourage new growth on the outer parts of the bush.

Propagate azaleas by pegging low branches into the soil and after a few months, lifting and transplanting those rooted sections.

We also received a glovebox booklet with helpful information and spaces where we can record important car details.

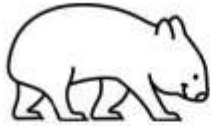
